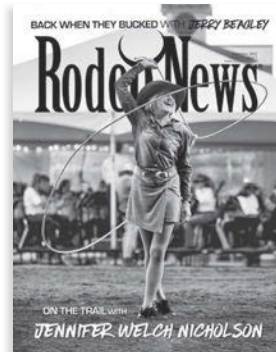

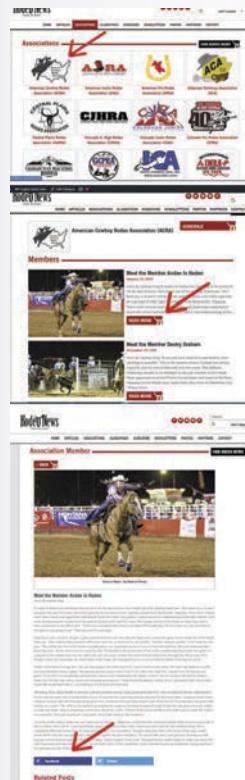

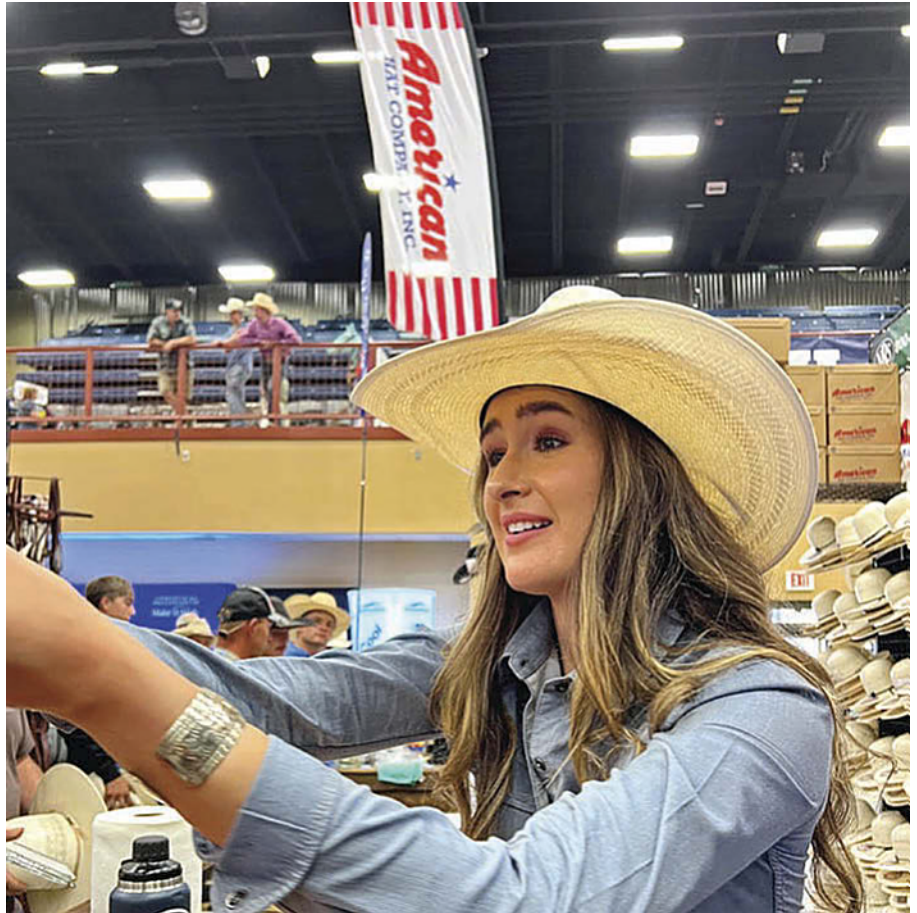
Emily Stephens has a few hats on these days, but of those hats, shaping them is by far her favorite one to wear. She is one of the few female hat shapers in the nation. “It’s a dying art and there aren’t many of us left,” she said. She learned the art from an older gentleman that creased hats at NRS. “Tommy Bishop encouraged me to learn how to shape hats,” said the 22-year-old from Paradise, Texas. “I learned from him and others and adapted what I learned into my own style.”

Here are a few of her thoughts about her passion:

- This is a true art form as it is based solely off of feel for the hat. You must have the right amount of steam in order for the fibers to loosen and then constrict as you mold the hat with your hands and the hat cools. By doing this you are locking the crease into place.

- I find that the coolest thing about shaping a hat is that no two hats are the exact same; they are fully customizable to the person that is wearing it.

- You can tell a lot about a person by the hat they wear upon their head and it never ceases to amaze me. You can generally tell what part of the country they are from, what discipline they participate in,

and if you have been shaping hats for a long time you can even read the hat and tell a lot about the personality and lifestyle of the person it belongs to.

- The hat industry is booming as cowboy hats are starting to expand in to the mainstream world. I believe this is because individuals idolize the western lifestyle and believe it to be a “simpler time” even though that couldn’t be further from the

truth as the western lifestyle has been built on blood, sweat, and tears. It is so amazing though to get someone fitted for their first cowboy hat and see them beam with joy.

- Cowboy hats are so special because they are with cowboys and cowgirls from all parts of the world, from sunup to sundown, carrying so many memories and stories. 🌟



I started my own little side hustle. I take old disgusting felt hats that were gross and turn them into something beautiful that can be worn and cherished.” Along with refurbishing hats, she and her dad are working on refurbishing an old hat steamer to help create the new hats. “The stories and memories can be repurposed - I started doing it for fun.”

As it turns out, I know way more about failing than I do victory in Jesus. The victory part I seem to be dismal at. The failing part, in a major sense of the word, I may be at a professional level. It is true that God uses everything and everyone for His Story. Yet, honestly, I fail. By faith I know that God will use it. Yet, the failure or regrets remain.

Please keep in mind I am not a pessimist or an optimist. Both will get one killed at worst and embarrassed at best. I am a realist. The cup is both half full and half empty. Allow me to be truthful about my “cup.”

I have regrets. Here are a few I am willing to talk about for broad readership:

Children: It always frustrates me, and has for decades, when we give ourselves a pass on parenting. A few hours a day of absolute laser focus would have been monumental. Again, sometimes I did my best. Other times, I took the easy way and got a pass. It maybe was good, but not my best. I hate that.

Friends: There are many who ask for attention from all of us. I have given lots of attention to the wrong people. Other times, I have given not enough to the right people. The reasons, in part, have to do with character flaws in me, I’m sure. Some of those I’m aware of, others I’m not. For those true friends who asked for more, I am sorry I failed you. For my friends who wanted to know my heart and I played it safe by talking about hob-

bies and the weather, I apologize. At some level, I believe if you really knew me you wouldn’t like me. That has made me cowardly on occasion. Overbearing at other times. I regret that.

Pastoring: it seems like this would be the one place where all my other failings fade away and I announce, in false-humility, one giant success story. Nope. It would be easy to god-speak and talk about blessings and victorious preaching. For me, that’s a nonsense smoke screen. I fail myself and my congregation regularly. This is the primary topic of my prayer life with God.

Despite all of this, I will carry on. Acknowledging these things will hopefully produce more meekness. I need it.

I’m sure more failures and regrets await. Probably in these same arenas. I will do what I’ve always done. Keep going and trusting in the grace, forgiveness and redemptive nature of a Good Father. I’ll never regret that. 📖

COLEE COX

“I crave the rodeo environment,” said Colee Cox, Team Cavender’s athlete from Childress, Texas. Rodeo has consumed her life, from hometown rodeos to traveling across the country to some of the largest junior rodeos in the country.

As one of the newer members on Team Cavender’s, Colee has felt so honored the moment she got the call recruiting her to the team. “I have always hoped I’d get to be on one of these teams.” While Colee has had other friends on the team they invited her over to one of their events and soon she felt the connection with the team. She often gets to compete side by side other members across Texas. It is common to see these ladies sweep the rodeo taking home first, second and third. “I want to be able to win more titles and have Cavender’s on my shirt while doing that.”

Imagine the feeling of claiming a National Junior High Rodeo Finals breakaway champion title and the next year, heading into freshman year becoming a state champion goat tier. This unique conquest is the reality, for Colee.

After tying a quick 6.6 seconds and a 7.1 at the start of the Texas State High School Finals Rodeo, the pressure and stress began to build. Colee had to wait a dreadful five days to see where she would place at the finals. She’d also been assigned as the goat-tying director, leaving her to stand in the arena and watch each girl tie in front of her. She returned in the short round sitting second behind a junior. “I was ecstatic I made it back and I was extremely nervous,” said Colee, “I chewed all my nails off before I even got

her local youth church group and her other pastime, golf. She is on her local school district’s high school golf team. While traveling to rodeos you may spot her on the local greens before the performance. She also finds time to show pigs in 4-H since she was in third grade, while other hobbies have gone by the wayside. Her secret love is baking. She recently learned to make scones and says her family loves her homemade pecan pie.

Colee plans to work on getting her PRCA card and make it to the NFR for her rookie year competing in breakaway. She also hopes that one day the PRCA will allow goat tying in the contest. Although she has already competed with and against some of the biggest names in breakaway roping, she wishes to share the arena with big names like Lari D Guy and Lynn Smith.

Cox shares that she is a music lover and has a special playlist that she blasts before each run. Her favorite gallery is titled, “Hype Rodeo Playlist,” one of the number one songs on there is “The Champ is Here” by O Fresh. She’ll also be caught drinking lemonade before a run, which is her favorite drink while on the road traveling and warming up.

This year, Colee’s goal in the arena is to tie a five-second run. Her current personal best is a 6.1-second run, and she is still pushing to shave seconds. She would also like to qualify for the American in breakaway roping. The goal is to be fast and consistent to step up her level with Ruby in the goat-tying arena. 🐾

to the back of the alley.” After tying a 7.2, she tied for the average and won the title of goat-tying champion as a freshman.

Being homeschooled has been a blessing for Colee. She trains day in and day out, working her horses no matter the Texas weather. “The truck said it’s 103 degrees, and I’m about to head out and practice,” said Colee. She has been working with her new horse, Ruby, which she bought a week before heading to the National Junior High School Finals Rodeo in Georgia in 2022. The gangly sorrel resembles a thoroughbred with hips that are taller than her shoulders making her look a little off balance.

“She (Ruby) has been just a blessing for me,” said Cox. “She’s not the prettiest confirmation-wise, but she can run fast and loves to do her job.”

While traveling the country competing in goat tying and breakaway Colee finds time to participate in

Coaching students that want to get better is fun and for the most part it is easy. Students that are eager to improve show up to practice ready to learn and ready to work. If you have any doubts, go watch a practice of a college team. I'm not talking about rodeo practice, go watch a good college football or basketball team practice. Within a few minutes you will be able to see the student athletes that are different from the rest.

For coaches it's easy to spot. Athletes separate themselves by what they do and how detailed they do their work. It's noticeable and they are coachable. Coaching is fun and exciting when you have students that are willing to embrace practice. Coaching is exciting to see students reach their full potential.

Believe it or not—after a few practices every year I can tell you the students that have a chance to make the CNFR. I'll repeat that, coaches can tell very early in you have what it takes to take your abilities to the next level. For everyone wondering what I am talking about, championships are won by the work you do in the practice pen. How coachable you are in the practice pen. Your attitude and effort that you bring.

Coaching is easy when students listen to improve. That is becoming more and more rare. Now many students are only

How do you help someone improve when they can justify excuses to themselves and to coaches? Student athletes that have this attitude become very difficult to coach and honestly take the fun out of coaching.

To be an elite athlete, students need to embrace being coached. Hearing the things that are uncomfortable to hear. Making changes that are not easy to make. The old cliché to be different than everyone else to have to do things that others are not willing to do. Coaches want to see you do well. Trust me.

What most students don't understand about coaching is that as a coach our success depends on the success of our students. For us to be successful we need our students to be successful. We need our students to be coachable. Coaching is fun and rewarding when we see our students be successful.

Jennifer Welch Nicholson is the 2023 Tad Lucas Award recipient. “I’m proud that I was able to live my life in such a way that I was considered for this, award” said the 60-year-old trick roper, rider, and Executive Director of Riata Ranch. She will join 15 other recipients of this award, presented during the Rodeo Historical Society Hall of Fame Induction, November 10 - 11 at the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum in Oklahoma City. “I didn’t grow up in rodeo, I had to learn this lifestyle from the ground up. I never thought I was that kind of person; I was shy!” Jennifer sees this award as an opportunity to tell her story. “I was just a young girl, and this became my life.” Born on the family ranch in Redding, California, Jennifer’s family

moved away when she was quite young. Her parents, Dennis, and Judy Welch, knew their daughter had a passion for horses and hoped that some time at the Riata Ranch, meeting her lifelong mentor, Tom Maier, and learning how to ride, would fill that need and she would eventually grow out of it. Her brother, Mark, was an outstanding award-winning athlete in football, basketball and track. Her passion only grew and then a trick rider, Kathy Batchelor, was brought out to the ranch to teach the girls a little bit of western entertainment. “I was enthralled and enamored,” she said about meeting legends like Monty “Hawkeye” Henson. “I never knew of such a character.” When it came time to perform, Jennifer, age 13, and three other young women, comprised the first rodeo trick riding team performing at their first rodeo in Bakersfield with

Rodeo Stock Contractors. “We didn’t know anything about rodeo.” The group began to expand their reach and with that they also started riding for the Flying U Rodeo. “It was Cotton Rosser and the Flying U Rodeo where we cut our rodeo teeth. I’m Flying U Rodeo raised!” They went on to perform internationally, building up Western riding in Europe in the early 1980s.

She went to Riata to learn to ride horses and become a member of Tommy Maier’s junior horse show team specializing in reined cow horses - then the trick riding and roping evolved. 2002 was an eventful year for Jennifer and one that changed the trajectory of her life. The owner of Riata Ranch passed away and the property was in bankruptcy. She made the decision to save it and created the new business as a 501 c 3 Non-Profit.

The biggest challenge was to rebrand, find new property and build new programs, yet keep the same values and integrity that Riata Ranch was known; Horsemanship, leadership, mentorship, education, and community service. A year later, Jennifer met and decided to marry Chad Nicholson. “I thought I’d met my life partner. And for 17 years that was true.” Between performances, they built Riata Ranch into a mentorship program for young women seeking the refuge and freedom that horses bring. From simple riding lessons to complex disciplines, Riata Ranch grew into more than just a riding program. It connects people to horses, ranching lifestyles and professional rodeo for a day, a week, a month, or lifetime.

Jennifer learned many life lessons on the Riata Ranch growing up. “It helped me become tough, resilient, and endure crisis.” She learned to have a plan A, B, C, And D. “There is always a way to go – and

you have to figure that piece out.” Jennifer lost the love of her life, Riata Ranch almost twice, and her dad got sick and passed

away all within a year. “When I came out of it, I was a changed person – we all have choices – you make those based on what you want, and I wanted to keep going.”

2019 started out like any other year, full of promise and opportunity. But, sadly, in May of that year, Chad was killed in a freak auto accident. And that event

changed everything.

“The Friday night I got word that Chad had passed away I was in Hayward at the Rowell ranch Rodeo in California. Surrounded by Randy and Michelle Corley, Cindy Rosser and a handful of other rodeo family, I was consoled and sent home with the girls.

I got home stunned and dazed. Earlier

to scream but I realized they were asking, "What can we do for you right at this moment?" Funny how you can be so unreasonable when you are in the grip of grief and despair. So, when I understand their compassion to help me right at the moment, I knew exactly what I didn't want to do...I didn't want to clean, I didn't want to cook and I didn't want to pick up dog poop!

That was my first glimpse into a way to move forward, just not today. Bring it to a simplistic level and ask for help. Don't bury your head in the sand and just put one foot in front of the other. I really fell apart, but not in public. I kept going and the people around me allowed me to keep going. It was the resilience – life is not fair and hard tough things happen."

Jennifer moved forward again.

in the year, a dear friend and Three Rivers Icon had also passed away and Chad and I had agreed to let the family host a memorial service for Earl McKee that Saturday for 400 people. As his (Earl McKee) service was happening I tried my best to disappear against the wall of my home. It was less than 24 hours, and I was still comprehending the loss of my husband, my partner, my future.

As the service ended, I went inside feeling numb and not having any idea whether to cry or to be still. Soon, people started coming in with food and buzzing around asking me if there was anything they could for me. At first, I just wanted

"Everyone gave me a grace period and I had wonderful people around me." She knew the best way to continue was to build on what she and Chad started at Riata Ranch. "After Chad passed away, I had some down time, and saw things I needed to change. I realized I wasn't communicating my expectations. I learned to be more upfront about things." She is working on growing and building relationships and that includes giving more definite clear pictures of what she is doing.

levels for these girls to pass – they are benchmarks.” The biggest requirement is true passion. “We can provide any of the actual needs, but we can’t provide the want to.”

She has developed leadership skills along the way. “It’s more than putting someone in charge, a good leader goes beyond that and realizes the value of their people and that includes having difficult conversations. If there is something I’m trying to achieve, I’ve got to figure out how to have a difference of opinion. The better equipped we are at handling the negatives, the better off we are.”

Her time is split between traveling, performing, teaching, and administrative duties. “I love teaching, and I like connecting with people.” She is realizing that she has changed – that she meets hard challenges with thoughts on how she chooses her words and what she hopes for the results. “That’s leadership.” She is hoping to swing the pendulum a little more towards home and groom someone to take over the business end so she can teach or perform with the girls.

“It’s a labor of love that I feel is more important than ever to educate about: teaching people from all around the world about livestock, how our food is produced and our western lifestyle.”

“I was passive – but sometimes I think it left people with a bigger gap to close.” She realizes that young girls come to her with stars in their eyes. She was the same way. “I tell them that this is a journey, and the commitments are real. We have red, white, blue, and silver

A tiny lady bronc rider from the Nebraska sand-hill country, Tad Lucas was the youngest of 24 children born to a pioneer family. She rode bulls in the main streets of Cody, Neb., during World War I to raise money for the Red Cross. In 1921, Lucas spent three months in Mexico as a bronc rider with California Frank's Rodeo Co. In 1922, she met Buck Lucas, and two years later, they were married. She added trick riding to her repertoire and went to London's Wembley Stadium with the Tex Austin Rodeo. She rode for several years in the C. B. Irwin rodeos, riding relays and pony express races, saddle broncs and trick riding. Trick riding was a contest event in the 1920s and Lucas won the event at the Cheyenne (Wyo.) Frontier Days eight consecutive times. At the 1933 Chicago World's Fair, her arm was crushed while trick riding, but three years in a cast didn't stop her. She rode her last bucking horse in 1964 at the age of 62. She served many years on the PRCA Board of Direc-

tors and the board of the Rodeo Historical Society. Lucas died Feb. 23, 1990.

Tad was a woman of not only great talent, but of spirit, courage and compassion. The Tad Lucas award is awarded to women who have exhibited the same sort of extraordinary characteristics while upholding and promoting our great Western heritage.

["I was just a young girl, and this became my life," said this year's recipient, Jennifer Welch Nicholson.]

"Jennifer is the epitome of what Tad Lucas was – even down to the red boots.," said 2017 recipient, Karin Rosser. "When we put the openings on for 10 years, we hired them (Riata Ranch Cowboys-Girls) to come to the rodeos. They would bring black paints out and carry flags." Karin has known Jennifer since she was a teenager. "She's a hard worker and has been through a lot and keeps a smile on her face. She has a charismatic attitude and realizes that change is part of it – she can put together

Back When They Bucked with

JERRY BEAGLEY

["I owe it all to my parents, my friends and Jesus."]
2023 Cowboy Hall of Fame Inductee

Jerry Beagley has enjoyed a Western way of living from the time he was born. He was born in Medicine Lodge, Kansas, October 2, 1954 to Otto and Evelyn Beagley. He was an only child. His dad was foreman for the Chain Ranch, located in Kansas and Oklahoma. The Chain Ranch ran 2,500 mama cows. His dad always had good horses. In addition to his dad being foreman of the Kansas part of this major ranch he was also in demand as a pickup man at various area rodeos.

When Jerry was 4 years old his dad would put him on calves and run alongside holding him by his belt, so he wouldn't fall off. Jerry was seven when his parents took him to the 1961 National Finals Rodeo in Dallas. As he watched the cowboys compete he asked his mother, "Do you think I will ever be good enough to compete at the National Finals?" She said, "Of course, son, you will be good enough." Jerry said his mother never lied to him, so he always knew he could do it. The first big bull he rode was at a rodeo in Turley, Oklahoma at age 12.

As a youngster he competed in Little Britches Rodeos in goat tying, flag races and more. His sophomore year in high school at an FFA rodeo in Freedom, Oklahoma, they were using feisty wild Hereford cows. The stock contractor told Jerry's dad Jerry couldn't ride one of his cows. Jerry's dad bet him Jerry could. Jerry knew his dad didn't make a lot of money, and was concerned that if he didn't ride the cow his dad would lose the bet, and his money. Jerry did ride the wild cow, even though he lost both of his boots during the ride. He made the whistle! He also was the Kansas High School Calf Roping Champion. In 1972 he was the Little Britches Bull Riding Champion and All-Around Champ.

"I had extremely positive parents" said Jerry. "They told me I could do whatever I set out to do. They made me believe in myself." He was valedictorian of his Medicine Lodge Senior class.

He attended Fort Hayes (KS) State Uni-

versity and majored in Math. He was on the rodeo team and won the 1974 NIRA Bareback Riding Championship. He transferred to Southeast Oklahoma State University and at the College National Finals, in 1977, held at Bozeman, Montana, he won the Bull Riding Championship and the All-Around.

Sylvia Mahoney, author of "College Rodeo, From Show to Sport" wrote: "Jerry Beagley's eighty-two-point ride on Black Satin in the final round led to the bull riding buckle and helped his team win the Men's Team Championship." That was the year he decided to start concentrating solely on bull riding.

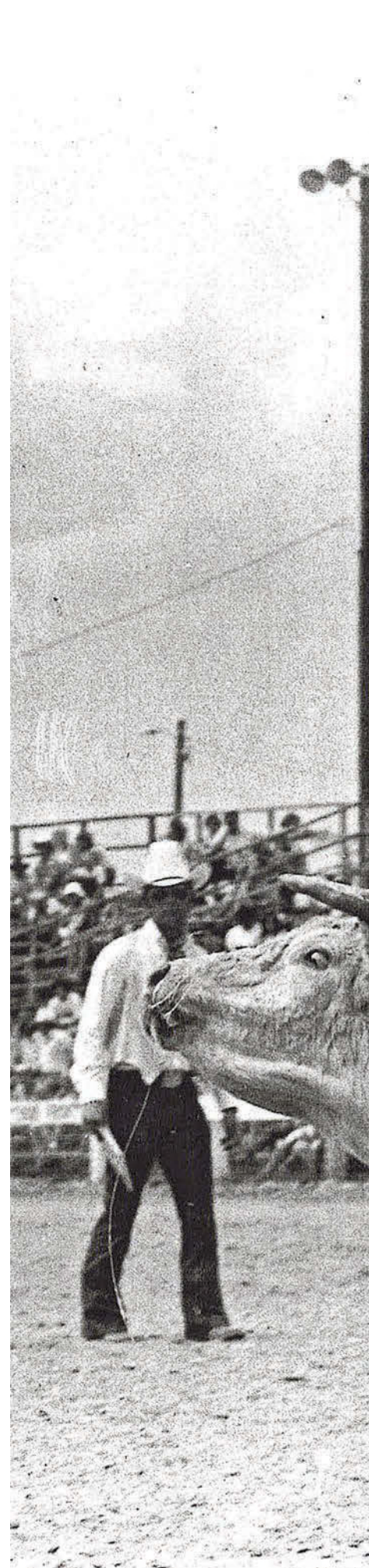
Jerry got his Rodeo Cowboys Association (RCA) permit in 1974 and his card the following year. Previously he had been making a living competing in amateur rodeos. Before he turned pro he had gone to approximately 120 amateur rodeos each year.

Jerry's mother was right when she told him, at age seven, he would be good enough to go to the National Finals. He went to his first National Finals in 1978. He was the Reserve Champion in 1979, just after World Champion Donny Gay, in spite of the fact he was injured after the 2nd round at the Finals. He also qualified for the 1980 and 1982 National Finals.

Injuries are part of rodeo, some events are more injury-prone than others, and bull riding is one that definitely causes injuries.. Jerry was injured in 1979 when he broke his jaw and had to have stitches in his face due to his injury. The following year, 1980, he qualified again and this time the bull broke his ribs in the second round. He tried for two more rounds to compete but it wasn't working. Jerry jokingly said, "Yes, I rode bulls -- I rode bulls before they began tipping their horns." This did not deter Jerry from continuing to ride bulls, but when he quit in 1986 he explained it this way, "I quit because I didn't want to get bitter about something I liked so much. I loved riding bulls."

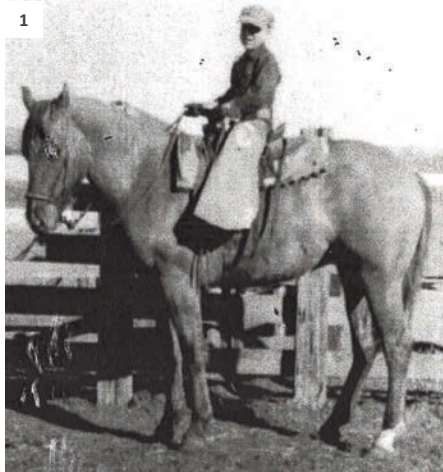
Jerry held Bull Riding Schools in various Midwestern locales. It was going so well he taught bull riding as far west as Hawaii

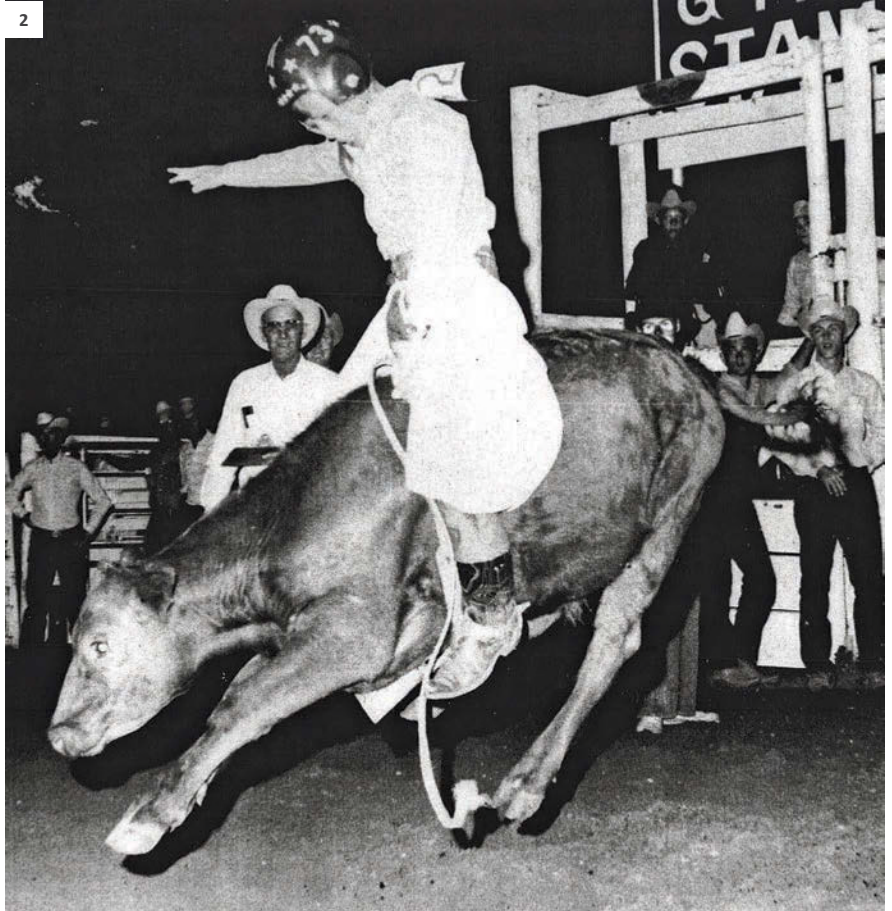

and Florida to the east. But that wasn't enough for Jerry so he took his Bull Riding Schools to Canada, Australia and Brazil. Jerry said, "Lots of students that sign up will never become bull riders. I tried to teach them how to have the right mental attitude, how to win, how to get from rodeo to rodeo, and much more. I wanted them to leave my school having learned something more than just how to ride a bull for their \$200."

The era in which Jerry contested was when those serious contenders found ways to get to several rodeos during the same weekend by flying. He got his pilot's license and flew in small planes to get to as many rodeos as he could. In 1978 he competed in 175 rodeos and 169 rodeos in 1979. He and Brian Claypool, another rodeo competing pilot, flew together a

great deal. Claypool was in a plane that went down somewhere in mountains near the California-Oregon border, May 22rd, 1979. Brian and three other cowboys were killed. The wreckage was not found for

months until a hunter found the remains in a remote area. Jerry explained, "If I hadn't opted to stay home and put together an anniversary celebration for my parents, I would have been on that plane."

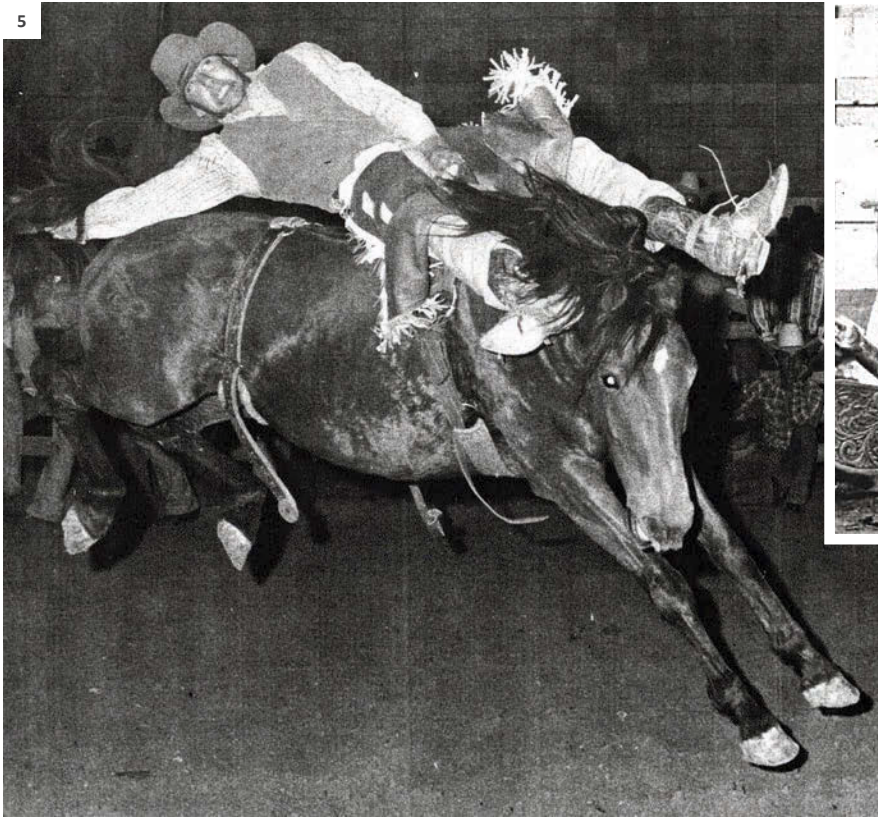

Other cowboys Jerry traveled with were Jerome Robinson, Lane Frost, Ted Nuce, Lyle Sankley, Bobby DelVecchio and Steve Lance. Jerry traveled alone more than he did with other competitors. The work ethic his parents instilled in him early in life kept him on the road getting to as many rodeos as he could possibly get to. In fact, Butch Bratsky said: "They called Jerry 'Mile-marker' because he got to more rodeos than most cowboys could or would get to."

Jerry worked extremely hard to get the Justin Sports Medicine Program up and going because

he believed it was important in the world of rodeo. He worked with Dr. J. Pat Evans, the doctor that was responsible for keeping Dallas Cowboys football players healthy for their games. Dr Evans started having medical people available at each rodeo to keep cowboys with minor injuries able to compete, and advising them medically if necessary.

The Christmas after Jerry turned 18 his dad gave him a hundred dollar bill. Jerry drove to Tulsa and bought as much nylon parachute cord as the money would buy. "I took it back to college and started braiding and creating reins in the dorm. They make great reins and presently I have quite a group of people braiding for me in their homes. It's called cottage labor and individuals work making items at home, send it to the company and are compensated for their efforts."

Jerry owns his own businesses, Jerry

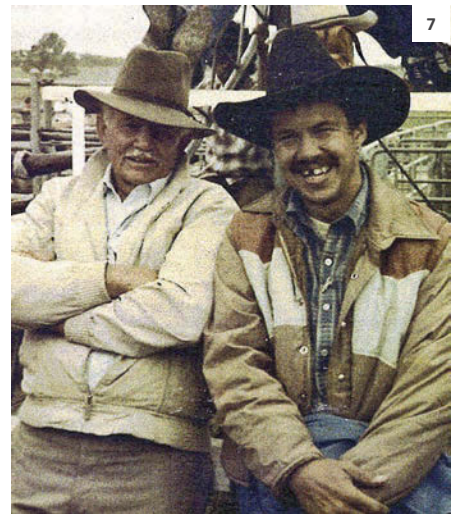

Beagley Braiding Company Inc. and Ott Ranch Saddles. He sells horse equipment wholesale, which includes over 400 items, for all kinds of horses – barrel racing horses, calf roping and more. He sells to over 200 stores in the United States. He also sells all over the world, including Canada, Australia, Switzerland and Brazil. Jerry met, at his bull riding school, the man who ended up providing through Jerry's company the bull riding equipment for bull riders in Brazil. I don't think it was more than a handshake, but it has been very successful for

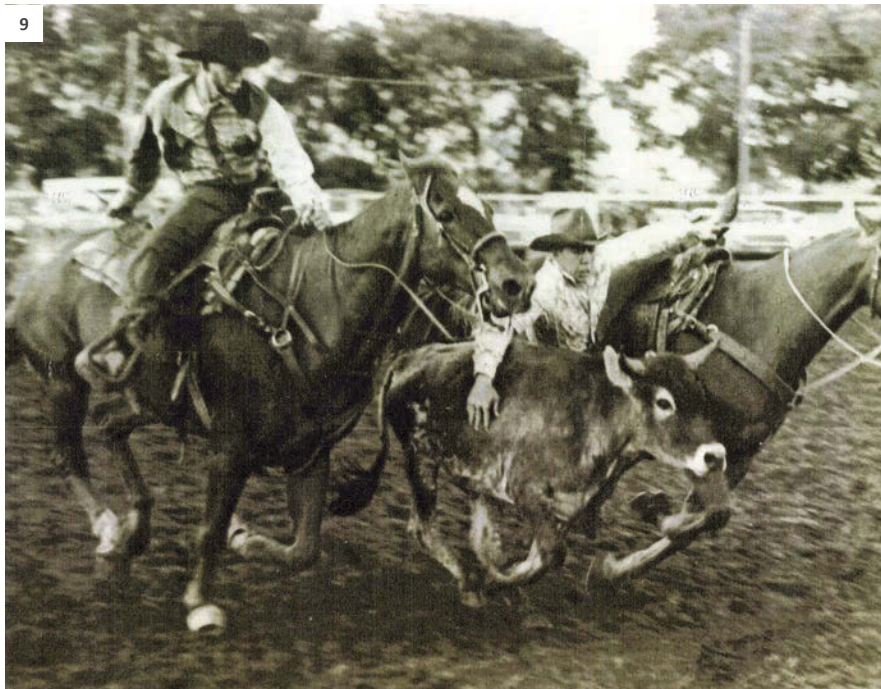

both of us.” said Jerry. He also met Adriano Moraes, from Brazil, who became the first Professional Bull Riding World Champion three times, 1994, 2001 & 2006. They have had a twenty-plus year friendship. In the early 2000s Jerry received the Small International Import-Export Company of the Year, in Oklahoma.

Martha Josey competed in barrel racing the same time Jerry was competing in bull riding and they became friends. Martha said, “Years ago at the Mesquite rodeo my hand slipped on the reins, when I was competing. When I finished I told Jerry and he created the ‘Martha Josey Knot Reins’ which have been selling for over 40 years. Jerry has such a good work ethic he could out-rodeo every one else. I can’t say anything that isn’t good about Jerry.”

Jerry married Beva Farnham, from Canada, and they had two children. Their daughter Martha who competed in rodeo in various events through college, presently she is a full-time mother to two children. Son, Brian, never was interested in the rodeo world, he found his passion in motorcycles and such. He lives in Canada and has two children.

The National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association Alumni Association was formed in 1982. Jerry became involved to be able to help students go further

dents he became a strong supporter of the fund raising part of the organization making every effort to get more sponsors to provide scholarship monies. Sylvia Mahoney said about Jerry: “He is one of the silent people that is always working to discover new ways for the Alumni Association to raise funds to support the rodeo teams. He donated a saddle to be raffled off to raise funds for the project.”

Jerry is a self-made man who has accomplished many things in his lifetime. He has given back by his efforts to rodeo in numerous ways. He has helped many young people just starting their rodeo careers. He is revered by those who competed with him and worked with him. He is his own man - an individual, honest, determined and perseveres, while displaying humility. He admits he owes it all to his parents, friends and Jesus. 🏆

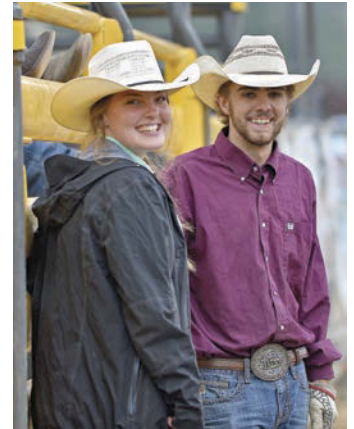

Meet the Member Shayda Lesmeister

“I’ve always wanted to be a veterinarian,” said 15-year-old Shayda Lesmeister, from Rozet, Wyoming. She’s leaning toward large animal and that could be because her dad, Shawn, is good friends with Dr. Wade Shoemaker DVM, owner of Countryside Large Animal in Greeley, Colorado.

She qualified for both barrels and poles at the KK for Vegas, Junior NFR Qualifier, held in Eaton, Colorado. She won the pole bending on her mare Sister, who she has tried to get in sync with for more than a year. It finally happened this year, as they grabbed another gear between state and nationals. “I always thought I could get a 20 or better, and I did with the help of others and not being so conservative in my runs.”

She finished second in the Wyoming High School in poles and third in the barrels last year. Obtaining two NHSRF Short Round Qualifications put her in

strong contention for the Rookie All-Around. “I kept it to myself and just let Shayda keep doing her thing, taking care of business one run at a time,” said her dad, Shawn. The late-night stay at the awards ceremony paid off when they announced that Shayda had won the Rookie All-Around for the NHSRF in 2023.

The great news also came with some sadness. She lost her prospect barrel racing horse during the National High School Finals, forced to put him down after an injury to his leg couldn’t be repaired. She lost some forward motion and was unsure how the rest of the sum-

mer was going to go as she transitioned from Stryker to PeeWee. “He is a horse that we found from a close friend of my mom’s” Shayda stated. It was a match from the beginning, they only had two completion runs prior to qualifying for the KK for Vegas. Peewee is an amazing barrel horse in his own right but Shayda fits him well. “My mom (Kachena) said, with a laugh “You better make sure this is the horse, and he fits you because Stryker goes back in my string after the High School Finals.”

“Now we’re off to Vegas.” she says joyfully. Shayda has never been to the city of bright lights before and she’s excited about it. Shayda tried to qualify for the KK for Vegas in 2016 when she was 8, but was one hole out of getting to make the trip on her horse Rocket. While the de-

sire to qualify has never faded, the timing just wasn’t right to accomplish this goal.

The family own and operate a ranch North of Moorcroft that Shawn focuses on running, a daily 45-mile trek, and they also own the trucking company Kachena’s dad started, which Kachena focuses on operating and driving for. It’s typically all hands-on deck when the workload of either entity requires. They hauled 1,500 head into the National High School finals in 10 days, hauling all the reined cow horse and cutting horse cattle. Shayda enjoys aspects and helps in both areas but loves trucks, especially hauling cows which is her favorite. She helps load and can unload the trailer by herself. She also enjoys going out to the ranches and visiting with them. Both Shawn and Kachena have followed the rodeo trail thru most of their life. “My mom (Kachena), followed the high school rodeo through the college ranks and on to PRCA and Amateur rodeos running barrels mostly. My dad (Shawn) tie down roped and started tripping steers when I was 9.”

The Lesmeister’s live in Rozet, which is halfway between Moorcroft and Gillette with a population of 25 people. She goes to school at Campbell County High School in Gillette. “It takes 25 minutes to get there, and I drive unless the weather is bad, then I ride the bus or my mom takes me.” Goals have been a big part of Shayda’s career since she started competing in the barrels in 2010 when she was just shy of 3 years old. Some of her future

goals include more success in the arena throughout her remaining high school and college career. 📺

SHELLEY
MORGAN

Pro barrel racer Shelley Morgan is no stranger to the ebbs and flows of life on the rodeo trail. The 50-year-old from Eustace, Texas, who's won more than a million in career earnings, has experienced the exhilaration of winning The American in 2022, and knows the sting of losing her beloved horse Short Go in 2010. The 2023 season lands somewhere in the middle of those valleys and peaks, and Shelley and her sorrel mare Kiss are doggedly working their way through it.

At the time of writing, they are sitting 21st in the world standings with \$61,709.87. "We're having a good season. Maybe not great, but good," says Shelley. "Kiss always tries hard. Our goals are always the NFR, but as long as she's healthy and sound at the end of the season, I'll be happy." Shelley planned to compete on both Kiss and another mare, Phoebe, this year, but with Phoebe working through a lameness issue, the bulk of the competition has landed on Kiss. Shelley and Kiss have been competing together for more than five years, beginning with futurities when Kiss was three. The mare, who won WPRA Horse With The Most Heart in 2020, excels in big outdoor arenas and is clocking steadily faster in indoor arenas now too.

With such a demanding season for the duo, Shelley is grateful for good tools that protect Kiss and keep her sound. She rides in a 5 Star barrel racer saddle pad, and boots up in their sport boots. "I consider them pretty versatile. I use just about the same kind of pad on all my barrel horses. I have a swaybacked horse, then there's Kiss who has high withers, and I have a young horse with no withers, and it doesn't matter what horse I put them on," says Shelley, who has been on the 5 Star team for three years. "I never feel like I have to girth my horse in two trying to get it tight enough. They fill in the imperfections in a horse's back and

pads. They never have sore backs when we go to the vet or chiropractor. The boots keep the dirt out well and have really good Velcro, plus they are so bright and pretty. All of those are positives when we're asking our horses to give their best. Anything I can do for them to keep them feeling good is a positive."

Shelley travels with her husband of 31 years, Rex, along with their German Shepherd and two Yorkies. They also have two grown sons, Zach and Tanner. She's entered more than 40 rodeos this season, a highlight among them competing in the Calgary Stampede for the first time in her career. "This was my fourth invite, but the first time I actually got to attend. The first time, I lost my horse, Short Go, right before Calgary and I didn't have another horse to take. The last two years there were COVID limitations, so this year it was pretty cool to actually get to go."

As the 2023 season draws to a close, Shelley is anxious to return home to

Texas and pick up working with several young horses she has started. "I think I do better if I ride my own horses that I've trained." Much of her focus will be on the full brother to Kiss, a three-year-old named Smooch. "He's become very sentimental to me. Not only because he's Kiss's brother, but we lost my dad (Bobby Bridwell) in May, and I had half interest in him with my dad. He's the last horse I owned with my dad." Shelley also has a four-year-old by Streak of Fling and out of Fames Fiery Kiss (Kiss's dam). "I've been really slow with him to let him develop, and I'm excited to add the speed and get him to where he can help Kiss next year."

"My next goal if I don't make the NFR is to stay in the top 20 or 30 to enter the big winter rodeos. As long as Kiss stays feeling good, I'd like to make it to Sioux Falls (Cinch Playoffs) and continue making it to those final rodeos. I'm just taking it week by week right now. Whatever doesn't kill you makes you stronger!" 🏆

In rodeo, he is a team roper (heading for Casen Pridemore), a ribbon roper (roping for Josey McClain), a goat tyer, tie-down roper and chute dogger.

Of his events, the team roping is his favorite, because he's been doing it the longest.

For the tie-down and ribbon roping, he rides a ten-year-old red roan named Red, who acts like a big puppy dog, Nolan said. "He'll follow you around. He always wants to be around people." Red can sense what his rider is feeling, and is "really strong, athletic and fast."

For the goat tying, he rides a four-year-old bay gelding named Boone, who the family raised and bottle fed. Nolan's been putting the training on him, and it's a satisfying feeling to see Boone get better at goat tying. "It's been really cool."

For the team roping, he's riding a horse that will do, but the family is looking for one to lease or purchase.

Last May, he finished his eighth grade year at Colorado Connections Academy, and loves science, including biology, science experiments, and learning about different animals. As for math, he's not so crazy about it.

Nolan plays on a travel baseball team, playing catcher, pitcher and third base. Third base is his favorite position, because "you get a lot of action and really hard ground balls."

The best meal his mom makes is steak, medium rare with mashed potatoes and Caesar salad. His favorite dessert is his mom's brownies with homemade ice cream. His favorite fruit is apples, and the best veggie is carrots.

Nolan had a lot of fun on a trip the family took to the Turks and Caicos Islands in the Caribbean five years ago. They snorkeled, hung out on the beach, went boogie boarding, and went bone-fishing. He especially loved the fishing for the beautiful silver-black, slender bonefish.

He likes to hunt and fish and has harvested an elk and a whitetail deer. The elk skull is mounted, the deer is shoulder mounted and both are hanging in his room. He also loves to fish for trout, both fly fishing and fishing the creeks in the high country at the ranch. He loves it when his dad fries them with garlic and lemon.

His favorite holiday is Independence Day, which also happens to be his birthday. On July Fourth, the family goes to their cabin near Creede where they fish in the lake and fly fish on the Rio Grande. His requested birthday treat is always brownies and ice cream.

The family runs registered Red Angus with a bull sale each spring. Nolan helps with every aspect of the ranch, his mom Katie reports. "We would not be able to ranch without him," she said. "He is such a big part of our operation and the day-to-day of what we do."

Nolan loves ranching, especially in the summertime when they move cattle on

horseback to different pastures.

When he grows up, he'd like to be a pro rodeo roper and run the ranch.

His parents, Katie and Dan, love and appreciate their son. "He is an incredibly intelligent, deep thinker. He is also very reliable. He's willing to help out, he has a big heart, and he really cares for others and notices when they are down."

In May, he finished his junior high school rodeo career as reserve all-around champion and is headed to the National Junior High Finals in three events: the tie-down, goat tying, and ribbon roping. Last year he went to Nationals in the goat tying. At Nationals, things didn't go as he had planned, "but it went pretty good," he said.

Nolan has a younger sister, Lyla, who is eleven years old and also a rodeo competitor. 🐾

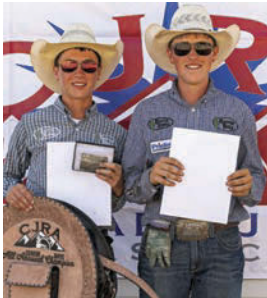

Meet the Member Quincy Montoya

Quincy Montoya finished the 2022-2023 high school rodeo season as the number three cowgirl in the world in the goat tying.

The Hesperus, Colo. cowgirl, a Colorado High School Rodeo Association member, competed at the National High School Finals rodeo in the goat tying and the breakaway roping.

The feeling of being nearly at the top was a great one, she said. "It was awesome. It was honestly an unbelievable feeling that not a lot of people get to experience."

At Nationals, her first run of 7.4 seconds was a "business run, to get me past," she said. Her second run was 7.5, with a "pretty good goat, but he shot left and I got off a little late, which caused me to fall and cost me a little, but it was still a good run."

In the short round, she was a 7.4. "I knew I had to stay consistent and make runs like I'd made all week."



She also competed in the breakaway at Nationals, catching both calves but not fast enough to get to the short round.

Quincy's goat tying horse is Leroy, a pony who the family got last fall. He's a "crazy little guy," she said. "He thinks he's a stud. He has a really long mane, a long forelock and a long tail. He thinks he's the most handsome thing ever. He's wild."

For the breakaway roping, she rides a sixteen-year-old palomino mare.

Quincy also competes in the barrels, but didn't last spring. She rode a twenty-year-old horse, winning state on him in eighth grade, but after that, a mountain lion chased him through a fence, so he was out, due to injury. He's recovered, but it's time for him to stay home more.

She and her sister Rhiley are training a promising young horse named Jags who is a fast learner, really quick, and making good progress. Quincy started him and Rhiley is putting the barrel training on him.

A senior at Mancos High School, Quincy is a member of the National Honor Society and is on high honor roll. With thirty kids in the senior class, she likes the small-school feel. "It's like a little family." Her favorite teacher was Mrs. Farrar, her freshman and sophomore English teacher. "She was so understanding and so helpful. Even though she knows nothing about rodeo, she's always asking me about it. She's a really good person."

She also plays high school basketball and doesn't miss much of March Madness. She fills out several brackets, and during the day, watches games on her phone at school. Sometimes the teachers catch the students watching and aren't happy, and sometimes the teachers ask what the score is. She's a

big Duke fan.

The best meal Quincy's mom makes is corn chowder. She loves ice cream, especially cotton candy ice cream, and she got her fill of it at Nationals, along with a serving of salted caramel ice cream. "It was so amazing," she said.

This past summer, Quincy worked in a real estate office, which she really enjoyed. She did a lot of the online marketing, taking pictures and making brochures.

She will compete in college rodeo next year, hopefully in the Southwest Region, "because it's so competitive and tough there."

Her sister Rhiley is a sophomore at Cisco (Texas) College.

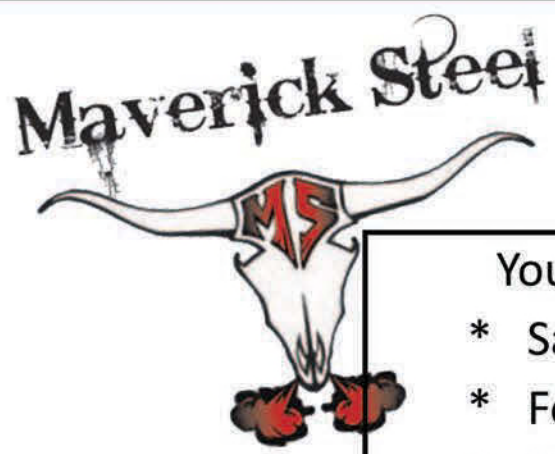

Meet the Member Ric Maestresjuan

Ric Maestresjuan from Jordan Valley, Oregon, has been part of the WSRRA since it's inception years ago. "I've been there since it all started," he said. "It's my 14th Finals as a judge," said one of the five current owners of the association. "I've been given the title of 'President', but we are all in this together. Everyone has their own strong suits. We are a team even though we live in different parts of the country – we've got Zoom."

One of the focuses for the association this year has been youth. "We're going to have ten junior/senior teams at the finals," said Ric, who produces the awards for the Finals as well as makes sure all the stock gets there. "We knocked it out of the park last year and this year is going to be better. We've upped the game on the stock to make it an even pen. We want all those guys to have a chance to win," said Ric. "We bring the top 20 back to the short go and we have the riders to do it. Burch has one pen and King has another – they've got that many good horses."

If not for the producers, none of this would work. "We've gone from 45 to 90 sanctioned events this year. 8 seconds

Whiskey is our largest sponsor, and we make those a 40 point Bronc Rides out of those stops. Any rodeo that adds more than \$2,000 in the bronc riding, they make a tour stop. It was a huge success last year, so moving forward we will keep the excitement going."

The Association paid out more last year than ever and this year the ranch bronc riders memberships have tripled. "We've changed the format and we are going to be on the Cowboy Channel for the Finals; it will be live on Friday and Saturday. "You've got to keep moving forward to being successful."

Ric is a custom saddle maker, originally from Winnemucca, Nevada. He was offered a ranch manager position when he was 23 and that's what he did for 25 years. He's been doing leather work for 40+ years. "My wife and I moved to Jordan Valley after we had just built a home in Winnemucca, Nevada. She (Rene) had retired from education after 30 years and the kids wanted us closer to them so we could be part of their lives." After more than 25 years in ranch management, Ric was ready to help his kids and slow down a bit. "My oldest, Teo, and his team have won the Finals five times,"

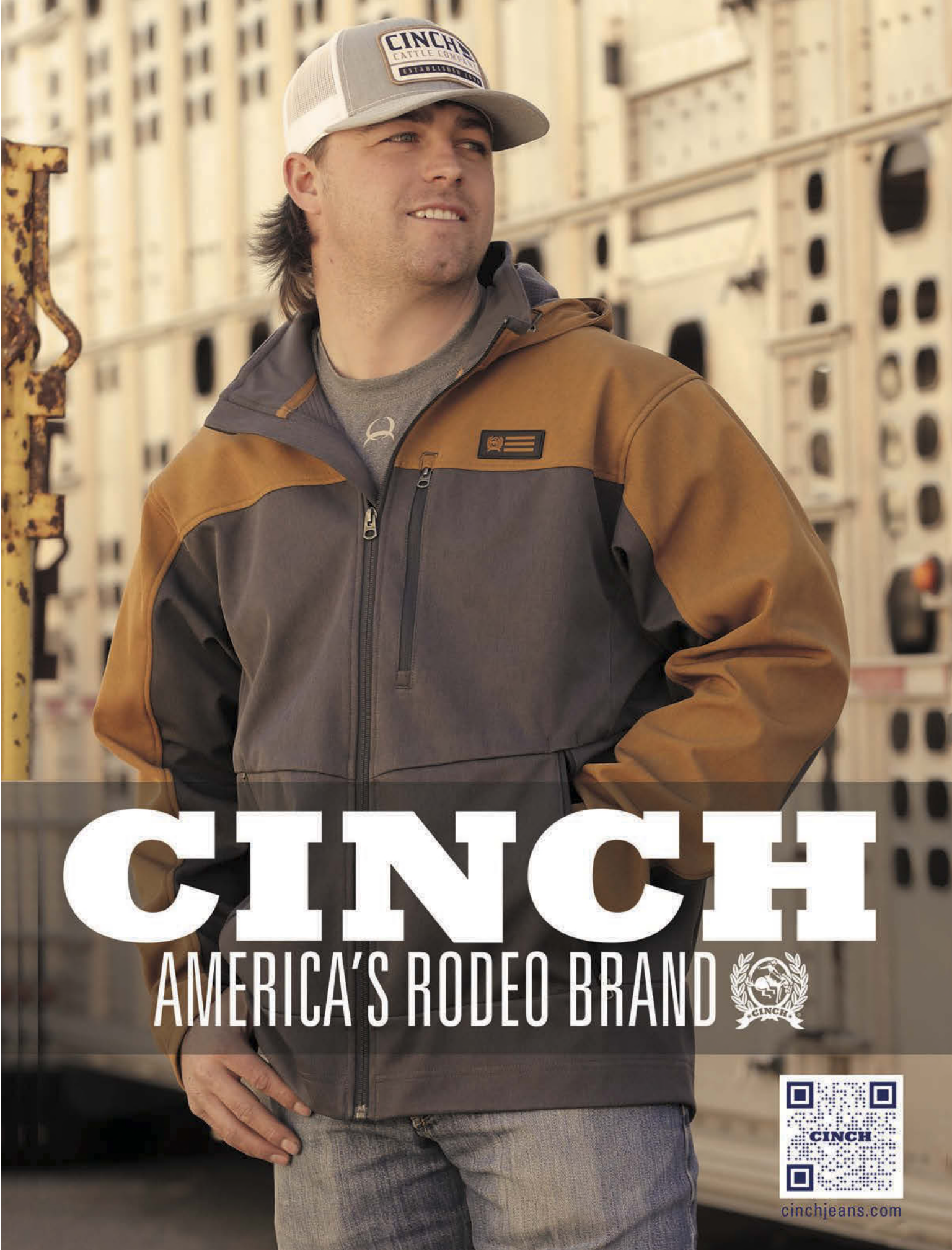

Meet the Member Amy Whistler

Amy Whistler has faced adversity and overcome it.

The Idaho Cowboys Association member had a baby at a young age, spent ten years in the U.S. Army, suffered ruptured discs, almost died last year, and faces life with determination and a contagious laugh.

A barrel racer, she grew up on the family ranch near Wendell, Idaho. On a working cattle ranch, horses had to have more than one skill, so her barrel horse was also her rope horse and ranch horse. “A working cattle ranch didn’t have a whole lot of room for a one-job horse,” she laughed.

After her son Brayton was born in 2004, she enrolled in the U.S. Army, so she could provide for him and get a college education. She was active duty for ten years and served one combat tour to Iraq in 2007.

After her honorable discharge in 2013, she moved to Boise and earned a bachelor’s degree, and over the course of the next decade had two daughters, Andreah and Arianna. Her first husband died in 2012; the girls’ dad died in a car accident.

Then she met Gabe McKay, who has filled a hole in her family’s hearts. “When we started dating, he didn’t over-step, but he stepped in. He’s been a good support system.” Gabe is a saddle bronc rider in the ICA and the PRCA.

They weren’t planning on marrying for a few years, but then along came baby Trason, who is nearly a year old. “He was the surprise we all needed,” Amy said.

When she returned from the Army, she began running barrels again and joined the ICA in 2013. She was off last year due to being pregnant with Trason, but

this year is shaping up well. She’s aboard ERU Famous Mr Blue, “Mack,” a grandson of Dash Ta Fame, who she purchased as a five-year-old futurity colt from Shelby Freed. After seeing him at a rodeo, her girlfriend urged her to buy him, saying, “if you don’t buy this horse, I’m going to.” So Amy did. “I’d never written this kind of check in my life,” she laughed. “Even though the money was in my account, I was afraid it wouldn’t clear.”

Now thirteen years old, Mack is “high maintenance,” she laughed. “He’s a very independent animal. My fiancé has had to take him to brandings to get his manners

back. Sometimes he needs those tune-ups.”

Amy and Trason nearly died last year when she was giving birth, due to a hemorrhage. Then, five weeks after he was born, she had a postpartum hemorrhage at home. She was unable to call 911; Siri the virtual assistant called for an ambulance, and she was taken to the emergency room. She lost three liters of blood, but has made a full comeback.

After military service, she worked for TSA. Now she is a supervisor for Spirit Airlines and United Airlines, sometimes

working as a customer service agent at the gate. She loves her job.

She also loves the ICA and the feeling of family it provides. The judges and leadership are approachable and the association has a sense of focus on contestants, not just making money. Her cousins are also ICA members, so rodeos are like mini family reunions.

Amy has advice for people who face challenges. She's seen plenty of them throughout her life.

Obstacles and life situations "will slow you down, but you can make it," she said. "I wasn't statistically supposed to be here. I had a kid at 18, I had my GED, I buried

two husbands, and now I have a bachelor's degree in criminal justice. I made it.

"I was never supposed to go back into the arena," she said. She's nearly a 100 percent disabled veteran with ruptured disks, injured knees from jumping out of airplanes as a parachutist, and a traumatic brain injury. But she isn't quitting.

"I have my own home and healthy children. You can do it. It's hard, and it's going to suck, but you can accomplish your dreams.

"Yes, some days you want to quit. But I want to show my children and other people that you can do it. You can go back to your dreams and you can achieve them."

Meet the Member Cody Miller

Cody Miller started rodeoing in 1993 for Idaho High School Rodeo within District II. His Dad told him he could only compete in the roughstock event of Bareback Riding. Even though his parents tried and tried to get him into roping, he was hooked on bareback riding. He felt the thrill the first time he stepped across one. Cody won Idaho High School District II Championships in both 1996 and 1997. Like many cowboys, that success was followed by a setback. One week before state finals in "97" he shattered his ankle and ended his attempt at a state finals as well as a possible trip to the N.H.S.R.A. Finals.

After recovering from that injury he joined the Idaho Cowboys Association (ICA). At that time the I.C.A. was running a pilot Novice Bareback Riding event. Cody won the ICA Novice Championship in 2004. Cody then took a few years off from rodeo for his family, however he was always looking for a way to get back into it. In 2010 with the help of his wife Amie they gathered up some gear and he started riding ranch broncs in the ICA and some years later in the Western States Ranch Rodeo Association (WSSRA). Cody really enjoyed the ranch bronc event, but always missed the bareback riding.

In 2016 Cody cracked out in the bareback event in the ICA. One of Cody's highlights of rodeoing in the ICA is being the recipient of the 2018 Charlie Stovner Memorial Award (a highly regarded sportsmanship award.) Charlie Stovner was a handy cowboy who lost his life in an accident and this is a really cool award to be given if you knew him at all.

In 2020 a good friend talked him into giving a new senior rodeo association a try. He joined the Professional Senior Rodeo Association (PSRA). That opened up a whole new world of rodeoing for him as he has enjoyed the travels to new towns, and the many new friends he has made along the way. Cody Miller has been the PSRA Reserve Champion 2020, 2021 and 2022, PSRA "Roughy of the year" 2021 and National Senior Professional Rodeo (NSPRA) Reserve Champion in 2021 in bareback riding. Along this journey he has also enjoyed being in leadership roles to represent his event. He has held a position of Board of Director on the ICA as both the Ranch Broncs and Bareback Riding events. Cody has received a gold card membership with ICA. Cody has been the PSRA Bareback Director since fall of 2020. To keep it simple Cody loves rodeo and it is his passion and wants

Meet the Member Deklin Titus

Deklin Titus is the reigning Nebraska Junior High School Rodeo bull riding champion.

The fourteen-year-old cowboy won the title in his final year of junior high competition, with his highest score during the regular season being a 74 point ride in Johnstown in the spring, on bull No. 195, a bull that jumps high in the air but isn't easy to handle in the chutes.

A resident of Wood Lake, Neb., he also competes in the goat tying, team roping (heeling for Branden Freudenburg last season), tie-down roping, and ribbon roping (roping for Tygh Miller last season.)

For the goats, he rides a chestnut named Billy, who has a blaze on his face. He's small, with a "lot of go in him," Deklin said. Deklin purchased the horse himself.

His tie-down horse is an animal named Pedro, his favorite, who his family claims is spoiled by his rider, and Deklin doesn't protest the point. Pedro is his favorite horse, purchased in part by him and a gift from his Nana. He has a bond with the gelding. "Ever since I went and rode him to buy him, we clicked," he said. "The first calf out, I roped him right off, like we'd done it a thousand times." Pedro is fast, tracks well, works the rope well, "all the good stuff for a calf horse," he said.

For the heeling, Deklin had to borrow a heel horse this past season due to an injury to his own horse. His team roping partner Branden and Branden's family graciously lent him one of their horses.

A student at Valentine High School, his favorite class is P.E. and his least favorite class is science. He is part of student council and in junior high, played foot-

ball, wrestled, and ran cross-country and track. In high school, he plans on sticking to rodeo, cross-country, wrestling and track.

Deklin does quite a bit of wrestling outside school time. He's traveled the Midwest, competing at duals and meets in Tulsa, Des Moines, Gary, Indiana, Council Bluffs, Iowa, and Pueblo.

He's involved in FFA and is on his school's high honor roll.

The best meal his Nana makes is a cheeseburger, but he also likes to eat rice and ketchup stirred together. He likes no-bake cookies, and his favorite fruit is fruit snacks. His favorite vegetable is corn on the cob, and his favorite candy is Kit Kats, "all day." He loves Dr. Pepper and jokes that he limits himself to one bottle a day – but the bottle is a 2 liter size!

The best trip he's ever taken was his seventh grade trip to the National Junior High Finals in Perry, Ga.

This past summer, Deklin worked in the hayfield. Last year, he ran the rake, but this year he was promoted to baler, and if mechanical problems arise, he can usually fix them.

For fun, he likes to go to a neighbor's lake, where they jet ski, knee board, tube and fish. He likes to hunt deer, coyotes, raccoons and skunks, too.

When he grows up, he may choose to be an optometrist. He had trouble learning to read; in kindergarten, he got glasses, but the eye doctor didn't realize he had double vision. It was his first grade teacher, Miss Lenser, who realized his vision problems weren't fixed. She helped him "a ton," he said, in learning how to read, and she was nice, too.

If he were given \$1 million, he'd use it to buy a ranch, build an arena, get more horses and tack, and invest whatever was left over.

He didn't junior high rodeo in sixth grade; in seventh grade, he went to state finals in all his events, finishing the year in fourth place in the bulls.

This year, he went to state in the same events and topped the charts in the bull riding at the end of the season.

At Nationals this year, he bucked off his first bull and rode his second bull for 54 points.

Deklin has a younger sister, Kealy, who is twelve years old.

He is the grandson of "Papa and Nana" John and Julie Hockenbary, and the son of Tony and Joni Titus. 📷

The family vacations are usually to Nationals, and the one that sticks out in her mind was in seventh grade, in 2019 to Huron, S.D. It was the first time they had gone to Nationals, and the entire family had fun. Her dad used to rodeo, and he shared stories about his rodeo days. “It was cool to hear his stories and cool to experience it all together.”

This summer, she worked two jobs.

Her main job was running a rake in the hayfield in front of the big baler. Her second job was at a North Platte coffee shop, where her favorite drink is the lemon cherry bomb. She preferred the hayfield, but she liked interacting with customers at the coffee shop.

Ali helped around the family ranch and helped with the Sutherland rodeo, too. Her dad is president of the rodeo committee, so she gets in on all the volunteer work.

After high school, she hopes to work towards a degree in education. She enjoys working with older kids. Last year, she was a teacher’s aide in a kindergarten classroom. She liked it, but 45 minutes with kindergarteners was plenty. She

WORLD-WIDE ENTERTAINER RED STEAGALL TABBED 2023 LEGEND OF PRORODEO

Red Steagall, who has had a 45-plus year entertainment career that has spanned the globe from Cow Camps to the White House, will add another line to his resume in 2023.

Steagall has been named the 2023 Legend of ProRodeo.

Steagall will be honored at the 18th annual Wrangler Gold Buckle Gala on Dec. 4 at the South Point Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas. Doors open at 6 p.m. (PT) with a reception and silent auction. The dinner begins at 7 p.m. with the live auction and program following dinner.

"This is a tremendous honor to be recognized as a member of that family that has meant so much to me and been such a major part of my life," Steagall said. "I'm proud to know that they accept me, and the rest of that community accepts me and I'm a part of the rodeo family."

Steagall's career spanned the globe from Australia to the Middle East, to South America and to the Far East. He has performed for heads of state, including a spe-

cial party for President Ronald Reagan at the White House in 1983, plus three overseas tours to the Middle East, the Far East, Europe, Australia, and South America.

As a native Texan, Red Steagall enjoyed a career in Agricultural Chemistry after graduating from West Texas A&M University with a degree in Animal Science and Agronomy. He then spent eight years as a music industry executive in Hollywood, Calif., and has spent the last 37 years as a recording artist, songwriter, and TV motion picture personality.

He currently ranches outside of Fort Worth, Texas, where in addition to his entertainment activities, he is involved in numerous horse related activities.

"This (Legend of ProRodeo) is a real milestone," Steagall said. "It is something I never dreamed would be possible because as far I'm concerned that title in rodeo belongs to the athletes and to the people who make the rodeo really work. To think they believe I have contributed that much in my life is overwhelming."

Although Red Steagall is best known for his wonderful Texas Swing dance music and such songs as "Here We Go Again", "Party Dolls and Wine", "Freckles Brown",

and "Lone Star Beer and Bob Wills Music", he also is beloved by Texas cowboys for the quiet times they have spent with him around chuck wagon campfires.

As a songwriter, Steagall has had over 200 of his compositions recorded both by him and other artists. He also has recorded 26 consecutive singles that tracked on the national charts and released a total of 22 albums. 📷

Meet the Member Anistyn Abel

The petite blonde Hobbs, NM cow-girl Anistyn (Ani) Abel took the Perry, GA NJHFR by storm when she roped her way to a 2023 Reserve Champion Breakaway Roping title (8.07 seconds on three) and fell third in line for the All-Around title.

Ani arrived in Georgia qualified in Ribbon Roping, Goat Tying and Breakaway Roping. She made the short go in the latter two events, landing 17th in the nation in the Goat Tying. Multi-event success is not a new pattern for Ani who regularly works six events at the Junior High rodeos -- the three events she qualified for Nationals and Barrels, Pole Bending and Team Roping (as a header). It also doesn't leave time day-to-day for much else except schoolwork and practice.

As before, Ani will homeschool through Tatum Schools for her 8th grade year. She says her favorite subject is Social Studies and learning about all the places around the world. Her goal is become a veterinarian. "I like going to the vet and watching what they do," she said.

Ani's recall of her very early rodeo life involved her favorite event, the Goat Ribbon Pull. She said she liked going fast and getting off at a run which describes her basic personality for rodeo today. At 13, she's a formidable competitor in the speed events as well as the roping. Breakaway Roping is her favorite of all.

Ani's older sister by five years, Rylee Grace, paved a solid road for rodeo successes and is now rodeoing as a freshman

with the Tarleton State University rodeo team. Ani said she will miss Rylee's help and encouragement. "She taught me how to tie goats. Now I get the practice pen to myself, but I'll miss her help. She took half the horses so that will be less work. But she's my biggest fan and I'm hers. I am excited for her." Both mom and dad take part in the daily 2-plus hours in the practice pen so Ani's not without help and coaching.

Ani says both her parents were big influences in her rodeoing. Her dad Kelsey was a calf roper, but now he says, with a laugh, that his job is "finance and maintenance for the kid rodeos." Casey, Ani's mom, was a breakaway roper and team roper (header) and can still handily do both. Both parents help Ani in the roping box at the rodeos. Dad is an avid note taking "calf tracker" and Mom watches the start. "They are almost always right," Ani said. Ani's aunt, Fallon Jordan, trains barrel horses and has been her coach and mentor for that event.

She believes her fine-tuned skill in Breakaway starts first with the horses she rides. Her rule of thumb for speed and accuracy is "get your tip down and your elbow up." When she leaves the roping box, she says her eyes are right down the calf's back and the rule is, "throw your rope when you can and don't track over its back."

Ani's rodeo string consists of a 14-year-old black mare, Gidget, for Breakaway that was also was Rylee Grace' previously. Melman is her 10-year-old sorrel Barrel

horse. "I like how chill he is and the way he turns. He's not automatic, I really have to ride him," said Ani. "Then I have Coyote for Team Roping and Goat Tying. He's a bay, 21, and he's the best one that we own. He came to us for team roping five years ago, but then about a year ago we started tying goats off him too. You can Breakaway off him and run Barrels too."

Living less than 10 minutes from the Texas state line and a daughter now rodeoing in Texas, the Abels opted to travel that direction for the coming rodeo season. Ani will compete in the five weekends of Texas Region 2 Junior High rodeos in the 2023-24 season, but will also "jackpot" at some of the NMJHRA rodeos.

She says she will really miss her friends at the New Mexico rodeos, but knows most of her competitors in Texas Region 2, so is anticipating a good year. "Ani has a true love and passion for the sport of rodeo," explains Casey. "She doesn't dwell on the hard places. She is very quickly on to the next one."

When you see a hot pink adorned cow-girl hit the arena, it will likely be Ani, making another run in a new season, but very much in Ani Abel style. 🐾

Meet the Member Dax Sullivan

Dax Sullivan checked out of his junior high rodeo career wearing a 2023 National Reserve Champion Tie Down Roping buckle fresh from National Junior High Rodeo Finals in Perry, GA. The prestigious title was won in Dax's third year of National Finals qualification. Meanwhile back home in New Mexico, the fall high school rodeo schedule was released and with it, Dax moved into a new league of competition.

The Canon Cristian Academy freshman says he's as excited about school as any guy who would rather be roping, but he is pumped about a new season of rodeo and a new level of competition. One might say Dax, 15, was born ready. "As far as I know, as soon as I was big enough to sit on a horse, they put me there and the rope in my hand came with it," he said.

A very young Dax started out dummy roping by sitting on a wood horse stand to rope from. He graduated to roping a burro for a time and then finally steers. "Breakaway and I mostly heeled until I needed to learn how to dally when I started heading and then I went back to heeling. Then we roped calves," he said.

Dax's earliest recall of competition was at a Bosque Farms rodeo. "I was a little bitty kid, mom said I was 4, and I was there on an old black horse that was like ancient, Mr. C. I went down there way faster than I needed to go, he turned the end pole, and I did not. I don't remember much after that except I know my horse finished the pattern without me."

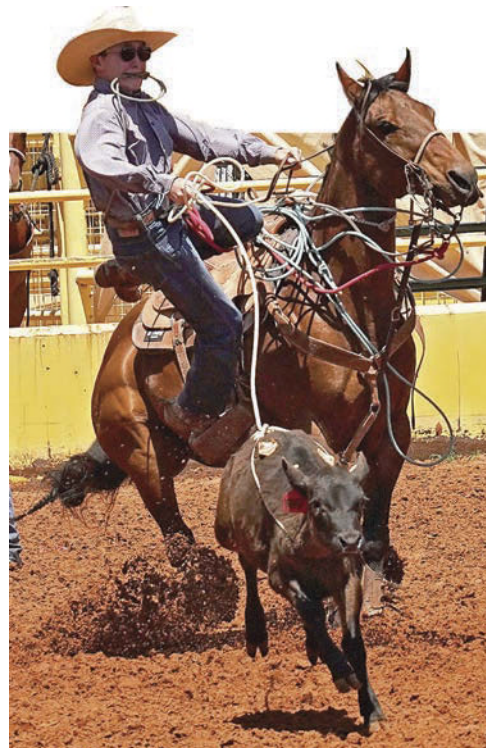
Dax comes from a family of accomplished competitors from both sides. His dad Russell won two High School National Reserve Champion titles in team roping and a Turquoise Circuit All-Around title in Team Roping and Tie Down Roping. Dax's mom, Shacey, com-

peted in Barrels and Breakaway in junior rodeos, high school and college rodeos. Her brother Shane Hatch was a NIRA Tie Down Roping Champion. Dax's older sister Quincy won the 2020 NHSRF Team Roping Championship as a sophomore, the youngest and only one of three girls to ever do so. Her senior year she was the National Reserve Champion Breakaway Roper. Multi-time NFR qualifier grandfather "Poppa" Larry Cohorn has been a major roping influence for Quincy and Dax. Dax's grandfather Darrell Sullivan, who ranches at Monticello, NM is also a team roper.

With no shortage of family support, an appreciative Dax describes the outcome with a laugh, "I get lots of advice." At the roping box during the rodeos Russell is there, and sometimes Poppa Larry. "If Larry's not there present, I usually get a text from him by the time I'm out of the arena. Dax recalled, "At the NJHRE, after I ran the first one, he texted 'Great run, that's fine, now bear down on the next one and come back.' After the second calf, he said 'Good job, do it again in the short go.' And after the short go he was so ecstatic you could feel it through the text message."

High School competition brings some changes for Dax. He leaves behind the Ribbon Roping and Chute Dogging. "I'm going to be calf roping and team roping where I've switched ends. I will be heading now, riding a plethora of Quincy's old head horses, starting with 12-year-old Flop (named for his very floppy ears.) He enjoys rank steers and runs harder than anything I have ever ridden. He's easy to score on and really easy to ride."

Dax's calf horse, 15-year-old Rick James, is the same horse Quincy rode when she won Reserve Champion Breakaway at NHSRF. "He's solid bay, 14.2 hands, bites a lot, and is like saddling an alligator," Dax laughs. "But he's a miracle worker. He can make a good calf out of a bad one. He's very special."

TRENTEN MONTERO

May 14, 1992 - August 30, 2023

Trenten Montero passed away Wednesday, Aug. 30, after a fight to regain his health following a rodeo accident. Montero, a bareback rider who qualified for the 2019 Wrangler National Finals Rodeo, was 31. Following his 79-point ride on Macza Pro Rodeo's Half Crow in Homedale, Idaho, the horse rolled on top of him, resulting in multiple serious injuries. Montero suffered critical injuries that included a lacerated spleen and pancreas, three fractured ribs, a fractured sternum, a collapsed lung, multiple pelvic fractures and damage to his aorta. Montero was hospitalized at Saint Alphonsus Trauma Center in Boise, Idaho. He was 24th in the PRCA-RAM World Standings with \$58,300.

Montero, who grew up in Winnemucca, bought his PRCA card in 2011 after being a four-time college finals qualifier. He rodeoed for NMSU from 2010-2014 and was an all-around hand winning in all three roughstock events during his

time as an Aggie. He qualified for the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo once — in 2019. That year, he finished 10th in the world standings with \$170,296. He earned \$89,538 at the NFR, highlighted by winning Round 2 with a 90.5-point ride on Sankey Pro Rodeo & Phenom Genetics' Prairie Rose. His ride broke the Round 2 Wrangler NFR

record of 89.5 points, set by Cimarron Gerke in 2004.

His father, Glynn, is a rancher in Winnemucca, and mother, Susan, is a teacher's aide; he has an older sister, Savannah

Montero and his wife, Maria, have an infant son, Noah, who was born July 26. They were living in Jerome, Idaho. 🇺🇸

He carried her and her cousin Breely Armes through the AJRA, where she continues to compete. “It’s a kid’s association and it’s fun. A lot of my friends do it and their families park next to each other,” she said. She likes cookouts and dances.

She has two go-to horses now that she hauls to the rodeos. “The speed horse is Cadilac, and the gritty horse is Barbie.” The gelding is bred for speed and Barbie is cow bred for goats and breakaway, but she is really fast in barrels too.

Lola is a fifth grader at Butterfield Elementary and likes science the best. “I like doing experiments and I like building things.” When she gets home from school, her mom has the horses saddled

and ready for her to practice on. She has three step siblings, two (Hunter and Hayes) still live at home. The high schoolers golf and play basketball. The youngest, 8, also plays golf. Sophie is in college at OSU. When she grows up she wants to be a professional horse trainer, just like her mom; and like her uncle, she plans to go to the NFR. 📷

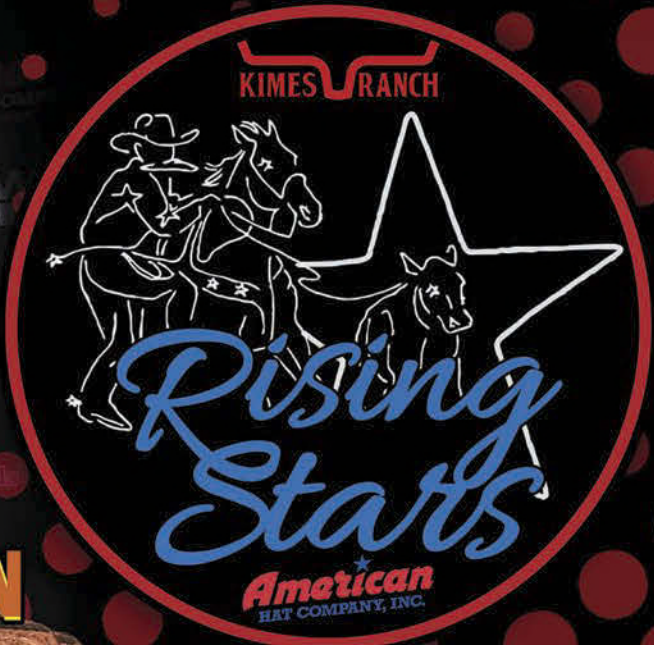

That year I qualified for the USTRC Finals in OKC, won several buckles, and met so many ropers I still call friends to this day.

As life happened, I was eager to have my own rope horse so I saved up every penny and purchased my ‘first’ rope horse from Joe Stricklin, and the rest is history. These horses shape us in and out of the arena and we don’t give them

While Hailey wishes she could celebrate these events and milestones, her path in rodeo calls for her to be on the road, chasing her goals.

As she has won championships over the years, she has also accumulated fame. After a race, fans call her name asking for pictures and autographs. Hailey is grateful to be a role model and to interact with fans. This aspect does limit her time to reflect after an event. She has had to find a way to balance these aspects. She's learned to turn on her 'greeting switch' after races and make time to reflect and learn from her run later on. She's found that she often has

time to reflect on her performances during her drive time between rodeos. Hailey often drives on her own, with her mom or a friend driving with her occasionally. This gives her time to reflect on her performance. "There's no real guide on how to handle that, it's just something you learn as you go," Hailey said. These challenges have grown her in her career.

No matter what, Hailey is always looking toward the future. She's thankful for the past and the aspects that have led to her success and championships but uses "that as fuel to move forward," Hailey said. "We're not going to get stuck in what we used to do, we're going to keep trucking forward." Hailey is cautious to not let her success of the past allow her to stop working toward her next goal.

Burnout often lurks in the back of many rodeo athletes' minds as they continue to chase their passions. Hailey, however, has a plan to conquer it. She has already experienced some burnout in her career and feels prepared to handle it. "I've experienced it so I can't say it's something I'm afraid of by any means," Hailey said. She

recalls when she did experience a little burnout. It occurred “because I got so fixated on the things I wanted to accomplish here that I couldn’t be content with what God had for me at that time,” Hailey said. She plans to guard her heart and not get fixated on the small aspects like wins and losses when put in perspective of God’s plan for her life.

Hailey is looking forward to her next goal as she prepares for the Cinch Playoffs in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. She is working hard to qualify for the playoffs. In 2020, she had the opportunity to compete at the playoffs in Rapid City, South Dakota. Despite the COVID conditions during that time, the state made a way for her and the other athletes to still have an opportunity to compete. Reflecting on this experience, Hailey is looking forward to competing in Sioux Falls under more normal conditions. She is looking forward to honoring “those people that champion us and our sport and allowed us to make a living in 2020,” Hailey said.

As she plans for approaching ro-

Sister currently has \$2.8 million in earnings and has always shown up ready to compete. “She’s had an incredible career and one that isn’t anywhere close to finished,” Hailey said. She picks certain rodeos to bring Sister to so she has less travel time and is ready for bigger rodeos. Hailey explains that Sister is “truly special” and is sure to keep Sister’s fitness up through workouts. Hailey also spends

time to make sure that she is communicating well with Sister and they are both prepared for rodeos.

When she’s back home in Cotulla, Hailey spends her time training horses. She trains horses for different purposes like ranch work, barrel racing and to sell. She trains an equal amount for her personal use as she does to sell at this point. When she is

travelling, her mom helps with the training when she can. Hailey has enjoyed training kid horses that are safe for children to ride and has clients in south Texas for these horses.

As she prepares for upcoming rodeos, she never forgets the reason why she is where she is. “I’m very thankful for the blessings I’ve had that allowed me to live this dream, but I always try to remember that I’m living this dream because of what God has for me to do, which is to give Him glory,” Hailey said. 📷

She is the 2023 National Junior High School Goat Tying Champion and won the short round. “They were really big goals,” said the 14-year-old, from Iowa, Louisiana. Ella will now compete in the high school level. “I will show them that a freshman can do it – age doesn’t intimidate me. I’ve always played up – both in rodeo and other sports. The only thing I can do is control what I do and I can’t control what they do.” She wears air pods to drown out the background noise and puts everything in God’s hands. “It’s always been like that. When I get to a big stage, I try not to express any nerves because my horse will know.”

She went to her final year in Perry, Georgia, in three events; the other two fell apart, but the goat tying made up for it all. Ella Kay’s practice routine is rigorous. She ropes on both of her horses every afternoon, ties goats with coach, 2022 College Nationals Goat Tying Champion, Kamryn Duncan, and conditions in the gym with different coaches at least twice a week. “I push sleds, tires, and run with resistance bands,” she said. “That’s helping with my agility and it’s helping me be more mentally tough.”

The crew that joined Ella on the ten-

hour trek from her hometown of Iowa, LA, was dad, Brian, mom, Dea Anne, and sister Addison (17). The whole family put in effort to support the world champion, “It took a big crew to get this done,” said Brian, who used to compete in tie down and now works as a supervisor at Westlake Chemical, “All the grandparents at home are taking care of chores; her older sister, Addison, is helping in the barn, and her mom Dea Anne (who is an elementary school principal), is keeping track of forms, fees, clothes, and cooking.” Her parents and older sister instilled in her that God is there to help. “Kamryn and I say this prayer before every run, God has a plan. When He’s ready, I’m ready.”

As winning the world caught Ella by surprise, her dream to be a rodeo athlete caught the family by surprise too. When Ella was little, she would beg her older sister and her parents to let her rope too. “My family didn’t expect me to be a cowgirl

and at first they said I was too young,” recalls Ella, “When I finally convinced them to let me try, I jumped on a horse and started roping.” Going into the sixth grade, she approached her parents again with the desire to high school rodeo. “I told dad I was doing junior high.” Her first year in the LJHSRA proved Ella to be a big deal indeed with her finishing her first season as a state champion in the goat tying. The second time around at nationals, Ella was wiser as to how to handle the pressure, “I changed not paying attention so much to points and just trusting my body to do the work.”

Riding three horses and roping isn’t all that Ella puts her heart and soul into. A student-athlete at Barbe High School, Ella competes year-round in her extra-curriculars of volleyball and softball. Ella’s passion for rodeo continues to be unyielding. She also looks forward to competing in high school rodeo in a month, where she hopes to be a four-year national qualifier all while trusting in God’s greater plan. 📌

Born Jan. 10, 1928 in Fort Worth at Harris Hospital to champion cowboy Buck Lucas and World Champion cowgirl Tad Lucas, Mitzi weighed 2 pounds and 14 ounces. Tad brought her infant daughter home in a shoe box lined with cotton, warmed by a hot water bottle and she made it just fine.

Raised on the back of a horse watching her famous mother perform in rodeo arenas all over the United States, Mitzi's debut as a rodeo performer was made at the 1934 Colorado State Fair rodeo at the age of 6. Tad had shattered her arm in a trick riding accident in 1933 at the Chicago World's Fair and a year later could only do two tricks. Mitzi did two others and between them they were able to fulfill Tad's contractual obligations. When Mitzi wasn't in school, she and her mom traveled far and wide to rodeos including Chicago, Boston, Houston, Calgary, Cheyenne, Madison Square Garden and of course her favorite the Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo. Mitzi and Tad performed as a specialty act for 20 years. Over time Mitzi's celebrity grew and Metro Goldwyn Mayer offered her a movie contract. While performing in Hollywood at the Pan Pacific rodeo, she had the opportunity to watch Roy Rogers and Dale Evans shoot a movie. It was "take after take after take" so her trick riding life seemed much more fun.

In 1947, Mitzi married cham-



pion calf roper Lanham Riley and together they toured the country rodeoing. Mitzi retired as a rodeo star in 1954. Lanham's rodeo career crossed over to training, showing, and judging horses in the early 60's. They built a home on a small ranch near Aledo, Texas in 1961 and raised a family of five siblings. Mitzi knew the joys and heartaches of motherhood. She lost 19-year-old son, Buzz, to a car wreck in 1970 and 31-year-old daughter, Lana, to cancer in 1985.

Mitzi spent her later years cooking, gardening, doing needle point and traveling the world. She gave up riding when her paint horse "Winston" got too old. Mitzi will be remembered for her infectious laugh and a smile that would lift everyone's spirits. Her love for animals knew no bounds.

Mitzi graduated from Arlington Heights High School in 1946 and attended John Tarleton Agricultural College in Stephenville, Texas, and TCU in Fort Worth. She is an honoree of the National Cowgirl Museum's Hall of Fame in Fort Worth and the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum's Rodeo Hall of Fame in Oklahoma City. She served on the board of directors of the Rodeo Historical Society.

She was preceded in death by her father, Buck Lucas; her mother, Tad Lucas; her husband, Lanham Riley; sister, Dorothy Stuart; son, Harold "Buzzy" Riley; and daughter, Lana Riley.

She is survived by her son, Kelly (Pat); daughter, Sano Riley Blocker; son, Lanham Tad Riley; and granddaughter, Bonnie Lucas Nelson (Walker). 🏠

Remembering those we lost

John Farris

*March 21, 1928 -
August 4, 2023*

John Farris, 95, passed away at Duncan Regional Hospital August 4th. He was born March 21, 1928 to B. A. & Eva Farris in Iowa Park, TX. On May 31, 1955 he married Mildred Cotton and the two eventually made their home on the Farris family ranch near Addington, OK. His rodeo career began at age 16, when he hitchhiked to Jacksboro, Texas, and rode a bull. He graduated from High School in 1944 and did many jobs while rodeoing. He joined RCA in 1959 and entered all roughstock events, roping and an occasional steer wrestling until 1972. His wife, Mildred, was a rodeo secretary and also ran barrels. He worked in some capacity at the National Finals from 1967 to 2011. He was NFR chute boss at the timed- event chute for

17 years, and also staked the barrel racing each year. For several years he was the NFR saddle horse boss for two years, served as the assistant roughstock event chute boss for one year. John also worked as chute boss for the Dodge Texas City Circuit Finals for 20 years. John and Mildred worked as a team for several stock contractors over the years. He was the Texas Circuit Man of the Year in 1997, the WPRA's Outstanding Man of the Year in 1997 and received the WPRA's Outstanding Individual Award in 1999, and won the Texas Circuit Best Footing Award in 2001. They were inducted to the Texas Rodeo Cowboy Hall of Fame in 2004, the ProRodeo Hall of Fame in 2006, and the Rodeo Historical Society Hall of Fame in 2010. Mildred preceded him in death in 2013. He is survived by two sons, Bill Farris and wife Sally; Johnny Farris and wife Jan, four grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. Memorials for John can be sent to: ProRodeo Hall of Fame; Rodeo Historical Society or National Cowgirl Hall of Fame. 🏠

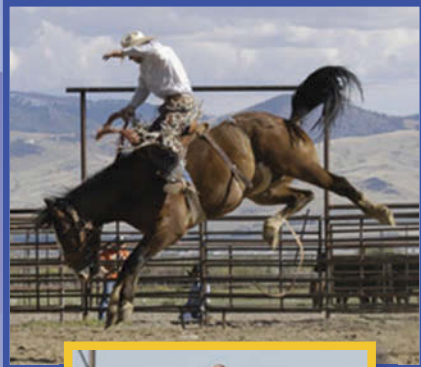

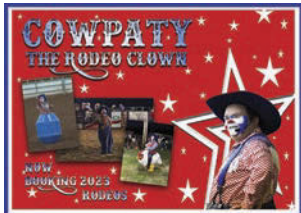
