PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

What's next for Phi Gamma Delta? Our strategy, at its core, is about 'Positive Impact'. On June 10, 2017, the Archons adopted a strategic framework to achieve this vision. During the months since, we have been socializing the plan with undergraduate and graduate leaders at many levels. We have introduced our strategic priorities gradually at the Fiji Academy and through a series of interactive Q&A webinars. Much work was done to evaluate our internal and external environments to prepare us to move forward from this point of uncertainty in the Greek system. We are confident that we have correctly chosen the battles we must win.

For the last few biennia, we have been focused on reaching 170 campuses and on engaging our graduates with graduate chapters in 75 cities and a 5/5/1 advisory structure for each undergraduate chapter. However, questions about the value and reliability of the Greek system threaten to rein in that growth prematurely. Our go forward strategy, at this critical inflection point, answers those questions. It is a strategy not just for our graduate volunteers and professional staff, but something to which every undergraduate member in every chapter can contribute. There are four strategic priorities, or must-win battles.

First is Maximize Value. The value of fraternity is its power and capacity for charity in the community, furthering the academic mission of the host institution, and enhancing the campus experience for all. However, the world is often unaware of many of our accomplishments and efforts. The realization of what value is possible is only limited by our willingness to try for 'better'. We are challenging undergraduate brothers: "Look at what your chapter achieved last year or last semester and just try for one more. If we try for one more service

hour per member, one more charitable dollar per member, semester after semester, we will raise our value." To build momentum, it is important that we communicate our goals internally of course, but also externally to university stakeholders. We can differentiate ourselves from every other campus organization and be regarded as a credible and valued member of the campus community if we are known for 'saying what we'll do' and 'doing what we said'.

Next is Empowered Accountability. Members are energized when they feel empowered, giving not just their time, but their hands, hearts and minds as well. Empowered brothers hold each other accountable to respect each person in their decisions and actions. Most of us would agree that to be respected is the most important thing we want from our brothers. Respect for each person extends to brothers, pledges, graduates, and the community in general. One of the easiest ways to demonstrate respect is to make our pledge brothers equal participants in chapter committees and as many chapter meetings as possible from day one.

Third is Know the Student Best. The leaders of our strongest chapters know their brothers as well as they know members of their own families, some even more so. **Luke Abbott (Minnesota 2020)** recently shared with me how his chapter brothers come together purposefully to discuss their interests, aspirations and motivations with each other. This kind of interaction differentiates a fraternity from every other type of campus organization. Chapter leaders who possess this knowledge and use it to connect their brothers with a compelling answer to "what's in it for me?" are wildly successful. I distinctly remember when, as a chapter president, I realized that I was spending my energy

on everything but having these conversations with my chapter brothers. Knowing specifically what student members want, savvy leaders deliver the right leadership and support to create positive membership experiences. This is essential in retaining brothers' interest in the Fraternity in their later collegiate years and extending the relationship beyond their college days.

Finally, Expand Smartly. With all that has happened with Greeks on college campuses, can we really continue to expand? Should we? Absolutely, yes. Our growth during the last decade has helped our Fraternity grow better and smarter. Other fraternities have had similar growth during this period, with several aiming for 200 or more chapters. We already have invitations to campuses through 2019, and interest in fraternities from students and emerging campuses continues to be strong. While our annual pace of six colonizations is less than the eight to nine of recent years, by 2030 we will be represented in at least one out of every four Greek communities. Of course, growth will be accompanied by chapter development, which is the process of organizational learning and transformation.

Nothing stays the same. It either gets bigger or smaller. Better or worse. You either grow or you shrink. Ultimately, success and growth will be gauged by how well our organization does relative to the goals it has set for itself. Our work now is to move our Fraternity to that better place where we want to be. Learn more about our strategy at www.phigam.org/StrategicPlan.

The Fraternity of Phi Gamma Delta

Do you have the experience and skills it takes to lead our Fraternity, which today comprises 150 chapters, 14 colonies and 11,000 undergraduate men?

Phi Gamma Delta Executive Director Bill Martin will retire in July 2019, and the Archons have initiated a search for the right individual to replace him. A search committee has been formed to run this process, with Brothers selected who represent various constituents in the Fraternity: Undergraduates, Archons, Educational Foundation, Section Chiefs, and Purple Legionnaires. The search will officially begin in July of this year with the acceptance of applications from qualified candidates.

As the chief executive officer of the Fraternity, the Executive Director directs and administers the day-to-day operations of the Fraternity and the International Headquarters, leading a 24-person professional staff and helping direct the Fraternity's countless graduate volunteers. The Executive Director reports to the Archons, who provide overall strategic direction for the Fraternity.

The Executive Director of the Fraternity must be a visionary, energetic, and action-oriented leader. He is the face of the Fraternity and an ambassador to undergraduate and graduate brothers, parents, university officials, news media, and other stakeholders. The successful candidate must be able to tactfully and artfully deal with crises and delicate situations. The Executive Director is expected to work cooperatively with the Fraternity's Educational Foundation as well as interfraternal partners including the North-American Interfraternity Conference, the Fraternity Executives Association, and leaders of other fraternities and sororities.

The Fraternity prefers a candidate with requisite non-profit management background, finance and budget proficiency, strong communication skills for both internal and external constituents, a demonstrated history of success in previous roles, and an outstanding temperament.

Salary and benefits will be competitive and commensurate with experience.

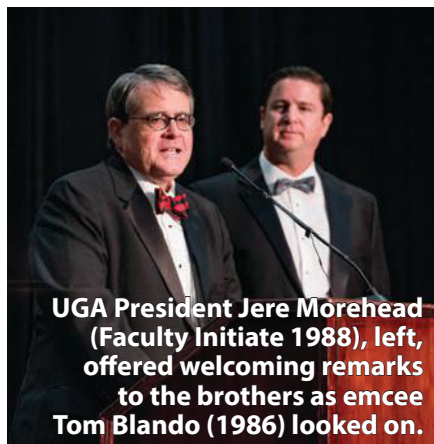

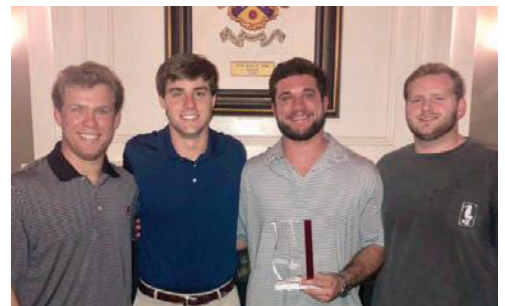
Alabama Birmingham

Brothers from the Pi Chapter set a goal to complete at least 15 hours of community service each semester. During the fall 2017 semester, each brother averaged 35 hours of community service, which is the most of any fraternity on campus.

In November, Beta Nu won the Intramural Flag Football Championship. The team was undefeated this year.

Auburn

Alpha Upsilon was #1 in grades for the fall 2017 semester with a 3.355 GPA.

Ball State

During the fall 2017 semester, Beta Sigma had the highest number of service hours per brother among all IFC fraternities and was # 1 in grades with a 3.208 GPA.

In February, the Chapter attended the 2018 Indiana State Day with nine other Indiana chapters. During the event, the Chapter was recognized for Best Graduate Relations and Excellence in New Member Education and Philanthropic Efforts among other Indiana chapters.

During the fall semester, Rho Upsilon participated in a charity food and clothing drive. And the fall pledge class partnered with Loma Linda University and Sac Health System for their annual Christmas Fiesta toy drive, collecting 550 toys for the children in the Inland Empire community.

They raised \$7,467 for the Angels at Risk Project and the American Red Cross by hosting the first annual Shea Invitational, a bowling tournament held in memory of **Christopher Shea**, who passed away in 2016. And 40 brothers grew mustaches during the month of November and raised \$3,400 for the Movember Foundation, an organization committed to changing the face of men's health.

Additionally, the Chapter participated in and sponsored Bucknell's 2nd Annual Sex Week, February 12-18, with all the Greek organizations on campus. Sex Week features programming, events and workshops aimed at the promotion of healthy consensual relationships and safe sex.

After **Rob Schentrup's** sister, Carmen, was killed in the Douglas High School shooting, the Chapter started a fundraiser to support the Schentrup family. Treasurer **Cody Breon (2019)** and Corresponding Secretary **Dan Oberle (2020)** designed red and gray bracelets that read "Schentrup Strong #DouglasHS" and sold them for a minimum donation of \$5. Within a few days, the Chapter raised nearly \$2,000 for the Schentrup family.

Coastal Carolina

At a track and field indoor meet in late January, **Connor Langdon (2020)** competed in the men's heptathlon, which includes a 60-meter dash, long jump, shot put, high jump, 60-meter hurdles, pole vault and 1,000-meter run. Connor broke Coastal Carolina's school record by over 500 points, ranking him as one of the top 50 athletes in the nation.

DePaul

Lambda Pi hosted the Phi Gam Karaoke Jam philanthropy event. The Chapter charged participants \$25/solo and \$40/duet, and all proceeds went to the Anthony Rizzo Foundation, a Chicago-based program that benefits people with Hodgkin's lymphoma. The Chapter created the event to support **Eric Dziubyk's (2017)** brother, who was recently diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma.

The Chapter also volunteered at Chicago's Hustle Up the Hancock Step Marathon, by helping with the event logistics and congratulating runners.

Colorado School of Mines

During the All Greek Awards Banquet, Gamma Kappa won the Golden Impact Award for the biggest impact on the local community, and **Josh Grego (2020)** won Outstanding House Manager.

Connecticut

On Halloween, Sigma Kappa hosted their first annual pumpkin carving philanthropy event, Carving for Camp. The Chapter sold \$5 tickets to the event, with proceeds donated to The Hole in the Wall Gang Camp, a camp in Ashford, CT, originally created by actor Paul Newman. The camp fosters an environment where children suffering from chronic conditions and diseases can escape and enjoy being a kid for a week.

Davidson

The Delta Kappa Chapter was #1 in grades for the fall 2017 semester with a 3.512 GPA.

Embry-Riddle

On September 25, Epsilon Rho hosted a BBQ and dodgeball tournament for their fall recruitment.

Evansville

Epsilon Iota was #1 in grades with a 3.42 GPA.

Quentin Meier (2020) and **James Wagner (2020)** went to the Alps while studying abroad at Harlaxton College in England during the fall 2017 semester

Florida State

The Phi Sigma Chapter joined other sororities and fraternities on campus to raise money for Hurricane Harvey relief. After a week of fundraising, over \$4,200 was raised and donated to Houston.

The Chapter also participated in FSU's Dance Marathon, March 2-4. Brothers stood for 20 hours straight to fundraise for the Children's Miracle Network and FSU College of Medicine. The Chapter raised over \$24,000, making them the highest fundraising fraternity on campus. **Jack Grenuk (2018)**, **Juan Fonseca (2018)**, **Justen Montgomery (2019)**, **Andres Yunis (2018)** and **Austin Moats (2018)** all helped organize the event.

Georgia

In September, Kappa Deuteron volunteered with the Oconee County Library Friends (OCLF) to help them set up their annual book sale.

The Chapter hosted a dance/band party for Extra Special People, a non-profit that provides opportunities for individuals with disabilities and their families.

➤ Additionally, the Chapter participated in UGA's Miracle Dance Marathon. The Chapter raised over \$51,000 for the Children's Miracle Network Hospitals, making them the top fundraising chapter on campus and one of the top three individual chapters in the U.S.

Georgia Tech

▶ Gamma Tau is participating in Georgia Tech Police Department's Adopt-A-Cop Program. The goal of the program is to help campus organizations develop more of a relationship with the police department, so the community feels safe and secure. By participating in this program, the Chapter will have regular interactions and will be able to plan training sessions and educational seminars with their adopted cop, **Gia Lockett-Hart (center)**.



Chapter Treasurer **Sam Medinger (2018)** was named Mr. Georgia Tech, which is the University's version of Homecoming King. To be selected as a finalist, Mr. (and Ms.) GT candidates must submit applications and essays, participate in panel interviews and give presentations on their leadership experience and impact on the University. Then five finalists are selected for the student body to vote on. The Chapter said Sam won this title because "[he] represents the values of FIJI...and is a great role model."



Gettysburg

► The Xi Chapter sponsored the Push for Entrepreneurship (PFE) philanthropy event on campus. PFE features volunteers doing push-ups to raise awareness and money to support entrepreneurial programming for young people. During the event, 12 volunteers from the Xi Chapter, Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternity and Gettysburg's wrestling team completed over 4,500 push-ups, with **Henry Scavone (2020)** doing nearly 1,500 alone. The Chapter raised over \$700 during the event, and the proceeds went to the Connecticut Invention Convention, which is the largest continuously operated program for K-8 entrepreneurs and inventors.



Grand Valley State

Chemocare creates chemotherapy I.V. cover bags that are decorated for kids undergoing treatment. The covers will hang over the infusion bags, providing a comforting image to the kids.



Illinois

Chapter President **Connor Riddle (2019)** was elected VP Risk Management of the IFC.

Hanover

On November 19, the Tau Chapter hosted the Clayton Anderson Benefit Concert for Madison Barker on campus. Madison is a senior at Hanover and sister of Chi Omega who was diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma last summer. Tickets were sold to the concert for \$5, and all proceeds were donated to the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society.

Several brothers were honored for an incredible season on Hanover's football team. **Brandon Merrick (2019)** was named Offensive Lineman of the Year, **Jonatan Ward (2020)** was named Special Teams Player of the Year and Second Team All-Conference, and **Peyton Head (2021)** was named Offensive Scout Player of the Year.

Wes McKinney (2018) was named one of 10 finalists for the Jostens Trophy. The Trophy is awarded to the outstanding NCAA Division III men's and women's basketball players who excel on the court, in the classroom and in the community. Wes is a three-time all-conference selection and was named the HCAC league's Athlete of the Year for basketball and all sports for the 2016-17 academic year.

Illinois State

Nu Iota hosted a bowling tournament called Bowl for Kids' Sake to raise money for Big Brothers Big Sisters.

The Chapter also initiated 27 men during the spring semester.



Indiana

The Zeta Chapter received the Chapter of Excellence award during IU's 2018 Greek Awards & Achievement Ceremony. The Chapter also won two individual awards. **Benjamin Paese (2018)** received President of the Year and Outstanding Senior awards, and Past Archon President **Dave Elmore (1955)** received the Herman B Wells Greek Legacy Award, for his consistent dedication and service to the IU Greek community as an alumnus.

Iowa State

During the fall 2017 semester, 60 Alpha Iota brothers completed 843 hours of community service, volunteering for the Salvation Army, Habitat for Humanity, Feed My Starving Children and Meals on Wheels, to name a few.

The Chapter also hosted the annual Fiji S'more Roast and raised \$2,800 for the USO.

IUPUI

On November 19, Iota Pi initiated 33 men.

In February, the Chapter's undergraduate and graduate brothers were selected to do the halftime show at the Indianapolis Fuel ECHL game

Jacob Shircliff (2019) and **Geoff Ginebaugh (2020)** were elected IFC President and IFC Member Development, respectively.

James Madison

Mu Chi raised money for Camp Kesem for the Fiji Island philanthropy. Camp Kesem is a national community led by college students supporting children through and beyond their parents' cancer.

Indiana State

▲ On February 10, Iota Sigma attended the 2018 Indiana State Day with nine other Indiana chapters. The Chapter received awards for Best Attendance, with 71% of the Chapter attending, and Best GPA Improvement, with an increase of 0.31 during the event.

Iowa

In November, Mu Deuteron and Mu at Wisconsin teamed up for their annual Rivalry Run to raise money for the USO. The chapters ran a football over 170 miles from Iowa City, IA to Madison, WI, with a ceremonial handoff at the half-way point in Dubuque, IA. The Chapters raised over \$23,000 for the USO.

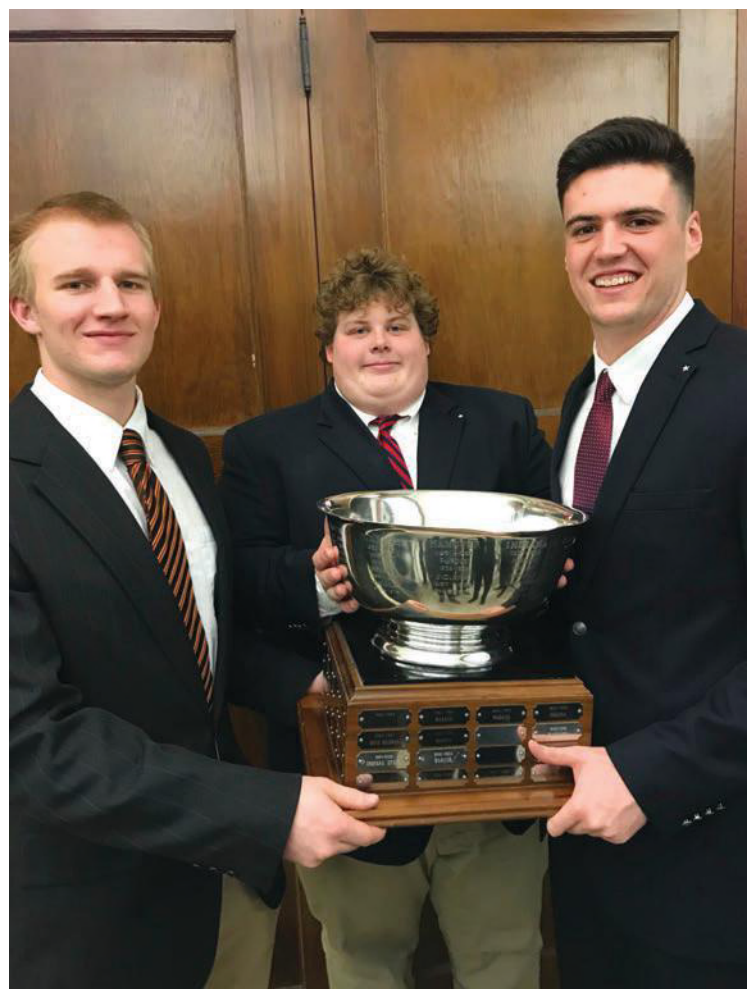
Quinnipiac

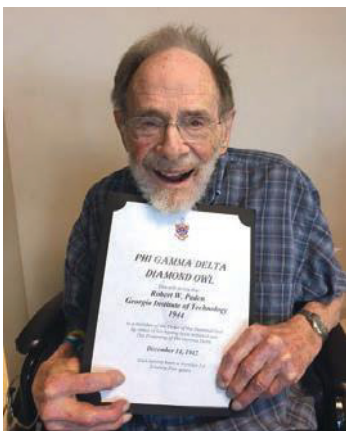

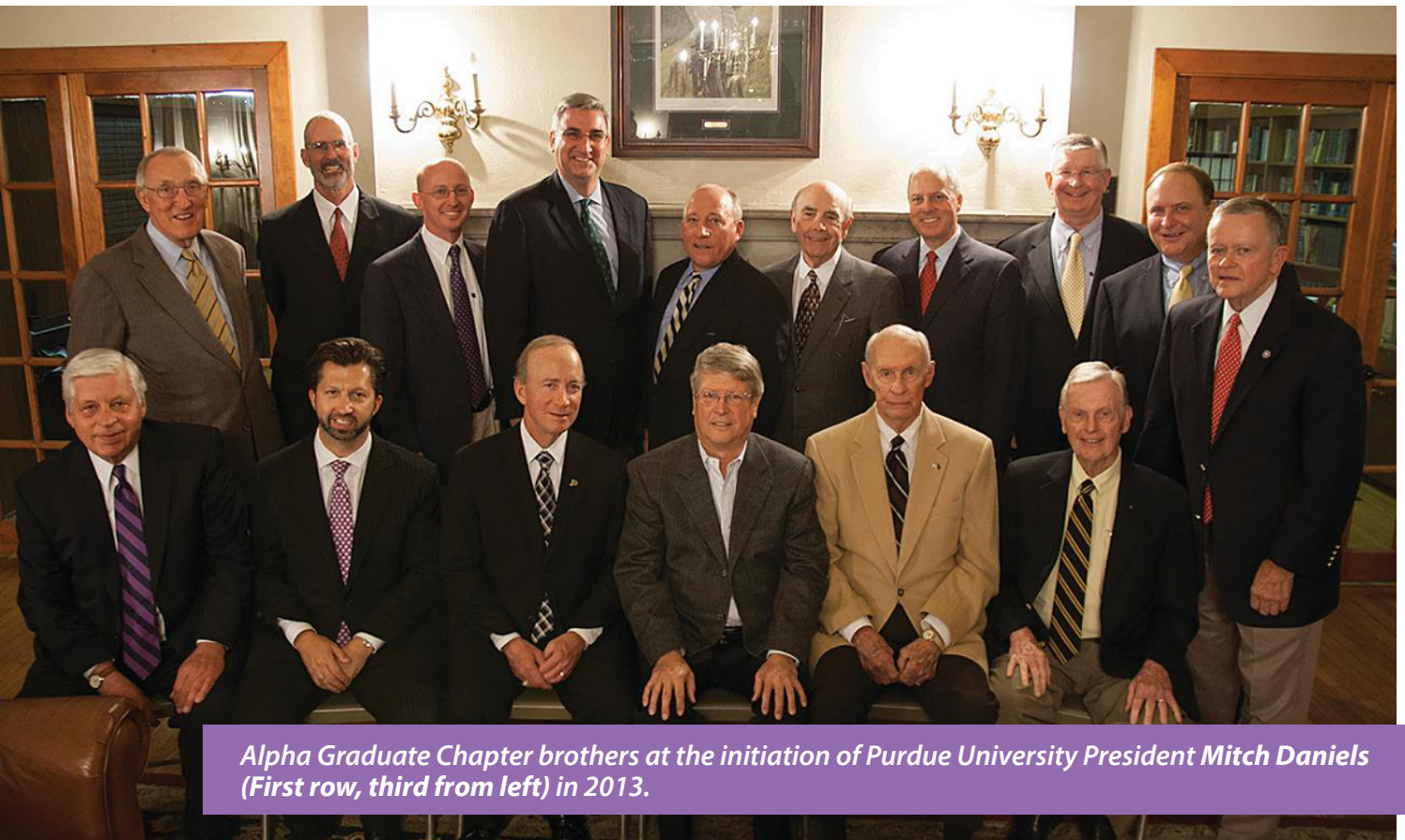

Beta (Indianapolis, IN) and Alpha (Lafayette, IN) petitioned the Grand Chapter on February 21 and March 12, respectively. Alpha's charter was granted on April 7, and Beta's charter was granted on June 2. (Both were granted before the law of 1880).

Celebrating 150 Years of Graduate Chapters

For 150 years, graduate chapters have been providing Phi Gamma Delta brothers with opportunities to expand their fraternity connections beyond their college days. Our **Alpha Graduate Chapter**, in Lafayette, Indiana, was chartered in April 1868 upon petition of eight brothers who had graduated from Jefferson College (now Washington and Jefferson) and Indiana Asbury University (now DePauw). Members of the Alpha Graduate Chapter today are justifiably proud of their distinction as the first graduate chapter.

Over the years the number of graduate chapters has waxed and waned. However, in 2006 the Archons established Graduate Involvement as a strategic priority for the Fraternity and identified the development of graduate chapters as one means of increasing that involvement. They set a goal to grow our number of graduate chapters, then numbering 18, to 75.

Today there are over 70 graduate chapters available to brothers in cities and areas throughout North America. In this article we will profile just a few of them. ▶

1880

Fraternity vote empowered the Grand Chapter to grant charters to alumni organizations. **Allegheny City graduates** were sanctioned.

1883

Gamma (New Albany, IN) was the first group to charter under the new law (and the third graduate chapter overall).

1886-1899

1886: The Convention abolished graduate chapters, but this was overturned the following year.
19 graduate chapters charter.

1900-1909

9 graduate chapters chartered, including **Seattle** in 1904.
1909: Four-story New York club house built.

National Capital Fijis (Washington, D.C.)

For over 240 years the real currency of Washington, D.C. has been relationships. **National Capital Fiji** is proud to have hosted Presidents, Supreme Court Justices, Members of Congress, distinguished military leaders, famous press figures, and their fellow Fijis for the last century. We strive to foster true friendships that allow Phi Gams to employ their Fiji Values for the betterment of our country. We seek to add value to the many bipartisan efforts our members are engaged in and try to bring disparate voices together to further constructive conversation around those issues.

National Capital Fiji, originally founded as Delta Chi in 1916, aspires to be the national model for "Not for College Days Alone." In this way, we aim to be a resource for our members throughout their careers beginning during their undergraduate years. With two planned colonizations in the Washington, D.C. area soon, we want the newest members of Phi Gamma Delta to benefit from the collective knowledge of the graduate chapter. We hope to provide them career guidance as they seek internships and professional development. Our National Capital Fiji undergraduate scholarship through the Phi Gamma Delta Education Foundation has already achieved this goal for two Phi Gams. We are eager to expand it and give more Phi Gams interested in civil service a chance to give back to the country.

With brothers participating in our activities from over 100 different undergraduate chapters, National Capital Fiji has successfully used social media to hold several noteworthy events. Whether it was the first D.C. Pig Dinner in 65 years, or a Congressional luncheon with our Democrat and Republican members during a government shutdown, or welcoming the Archons back to the University Club, we strive to host exceptional events that leave our members thinking "I'm glad I came. I'm glad I'm a Phi Gam."

Our graduate chapter crest is a combination of Phi Gamma Delta's heraldry and George Washington's to

remind us that service is a noble calling. Our motto translates to "Powerful and Worthy." Here's to 100 more years of Pressing On in the Nation's Capital.

Seattle Washington Graduate Chapter

The **Seattle, Washington Graduate Chapter** seeks to maintain and continue the fraternal bonds of graduate brothers. With strong ties to the **Sigma Tau Chapter at Washington**, we seek to further the success of undergraduates so that they might continue this tradition of excellence into the future. In this way, our chapter lives and grows on actively and perpetually demonstrating that our fraternal existence is not for college days alone.

Our chapter's staple activity is our monthly luncheon, which over the past year featured the head coaches of UW football and basketball, and the Executive Editor of the Seattle Times, among other prominent speakers. We are also pleased to say that our most recent annual Norris Pig Dinner was attended by over 400 graduate and undergraduate brothers.

But these activities only begin to tell the story of the Seattle Graduate Chapter. Our brothers, through our own Educational Foundation, raised \$40,000 in donations last year for undergraduate scholarships from our 5th annual golf tournament (which included 144 participants), and kicked off a \$2 million campaign to renovate the Sigma Tau chapter house. Beyond fundraising, the graduate chapter works alongside the undergraduate chapter on social service projects and has a long-standing mentorship program with quarterly projects with the undergraduate chapter.

The continued growth and success of the graduate chapter is due to our graduates – both of the Sigma Tau Chapter and those living in the Seattle area. We communicate to more than 1,600 brothers at least twice a month and rely on 30 graduates to actively assist in the operations of the graduate chapter. These brothers believe in and live the tradition of excellence that is the Seattle Graduate Chapter.

23 graduate chapters chartered, including **Delta Chi (Washington, DC)** in 1916. The Chapter now goes by **National Capital Fijis**.

1920-1929*

39 graduate chapters chartered, including **Toronto, Ontario** in 1924. This was the first Canadian graduate chapter chartered.

1930-1939*

12 graduate chapters chartered.

1940-1949*

10 graduate chapters chartered.

We host a myriad of events and activities during the winter months including luncheons, breakfasts, a spring training baseball game, and, of course, our own annual Norris Pig Dinner. We celebrate our Fiji friends from college days, and we treasure new local Fiji friends and their wives and guests.

You may think that SW Florida is an island, because we are basking in the winter sun...and 100 miles from the nearest FIJI undergraduate chapter. We do miss some connection to the younger members. However, the FIJI Spirit burns in our members' purple hearts.

Our feet are planted on the shoulders of great FIJI

leaders. A real moving force was **Edward A. More, II (Missouri 1939)**, whose vision and hard work resulted in the chapter formation. Ed served as our first President. The momentum continued for years with **John Peckinpaugh (Ohio Wesleyan 1953)**, **David Baines (Wittenberg 1969)** and **Bill Brock (Purdue 1963)**. The glue that holds our chapter together is **Don Meek (Ohio Wesleyan 1957)**, and another notable Fiji on our team is **Doug Dittrick (Ohio Wesleyan 1955)**.

Another key part of our program is a scholarship program started and named for Edward A. More, II. Many worthy Fiji undergraduates from the seven Florida chapters have received a scholarship. We hope we are a small part of building these outstanding and deserving young Fijis into tomorrow's leaders.

Through this hard work, our chapter has won the Brightman Award for most outstanding graduate chapter (with under 75 members) 14 times. This is the culmination of our efforts that we do, because we love being Fijis and love keeping the FIJI SPIRIT BRIGHT. ►

As Phi Gamma Delta has grown and evolved, so have its graduate chapters. After 150 years we no longer formally charter graduate chapters, nor do we give them Greek names. Fewer of our graduate chapters meet formally, preferring social activities, and lunches are evolving into after-work events. However, at its core, the purpose of the graduate chapter remains the same: "to strengthen and perpetuate the bonds [of brotherhood and] ...to increase the influence of and contribute to the general interest of the Fraternity."

More recently, in September 2006, the Archons identified Graduate Involvement as a vital focus area for Phi Gamma Delta. In 2007 the Archons adopted our Graduate Involvement initiative with the aim of developing and engaging brothers who are Loyal for Life. A key component of the initiative has been growing our Graduate Chapters, from 18 at the time to a goal of 75 by our 170th anniversary in 2018.

As we near our 170th anniversary, the Fraternity will be very close to, if not achieve, its goal of 75 graduate chapters – a 400% increase in graduate chapters over the past eleven years!

Today, there are more opportunities for graduate brothers to connect with the Fraternity, and one another,

than ever before. Whether our graduate brothers are participating in a Graduate Chapter, attending their Pig Dinner or serving as an advisor for a nearby chapter, they continue to set a strong example for our undergraduate brothers and show that Phi Gamma Delta is Not For College Days Alone.

What Is a Graduate Chapter?

Unlike an undergraduate chapter, which is based at a single institution, graduate chapters are based in a city or geographical area and give graduate brothers an opportunity to continue to develop friendships through the Fraternity.

Graduate chapters generally have a social purpose, with most of their activities meant to continue the spirit of brotherhood among brothers in the area. Over time many evolve to support local chapters and colonies, provide personal and professional development opportunities or support the local community.

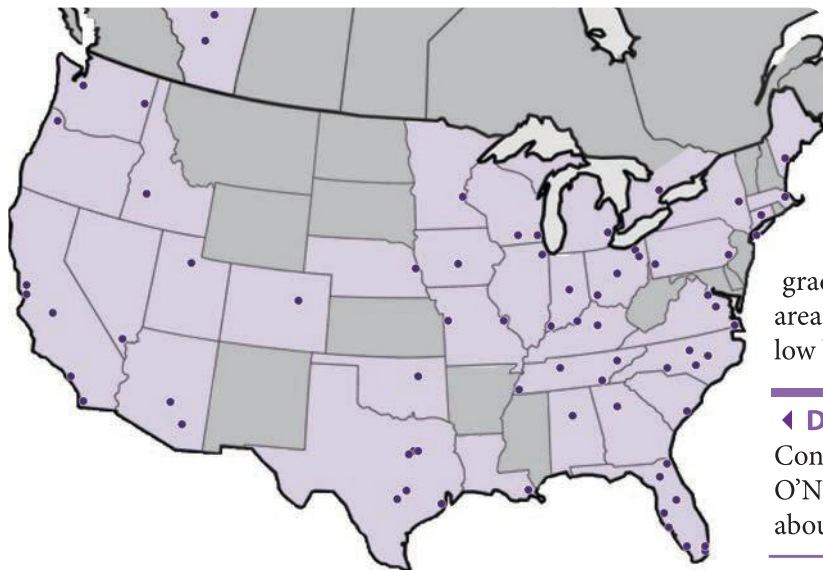

(*Including 68 Purple Legionnaires and 32 Section Chiefs*)



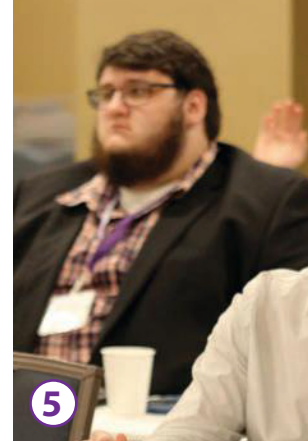

2 Pursuing Excellence

For many years the annual Fiji Academy has offered Pursuing Excellence sessions, providing our early arrivals personal development opportunities and the chance to explore areas of chapter operations outside of the normal officer nuts and bolts training. 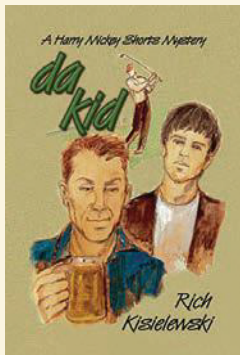

his CPA. He currently works as an accountant and recently completed all three levels of the CFA program and is waiting for the relevant work experience to receive his designation.

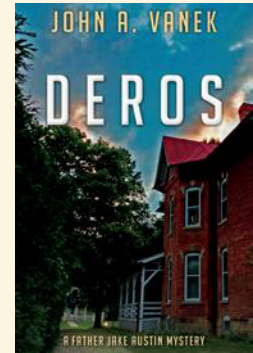

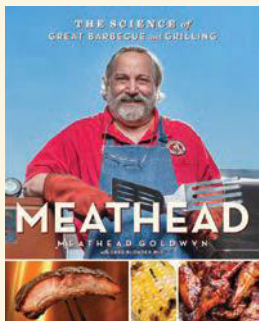
DEROS

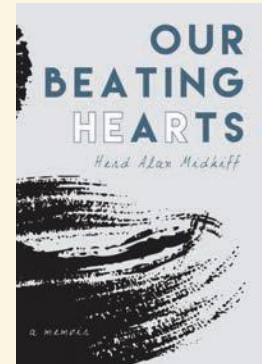
Brother Tilson was chosen for this award because he has spent his entire life in service to others. The choice to put others before self is a lesson he learned from his father, who was a

2017 HONOR ROLL OF DONORS

PHI GAMMA DELTA EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION

Last year's annual report predicted that 2017 was going to be an 'exciting year' for Phi Gamma Delta, and it was! In hindsight, we should have said 'great year'. As a result of the visionary and generous participation of brothers, we were able to accomplish all we set out to do

We are pleased to report that we are financially healthy as evidenced by our income and programs funded. But your continuing support is critical to our ability to serve your chapter and our brothers.

Academic Environment

Our first scholarship was issued in 1950 and creating a healthy academic environment continues to be our priority. We continue to be in the top 3 fraternities in total scholarships awarded - 1,217 totaling \$389,150. The spring 2017 all Phi Gam GPA was 3.14.

Leadership Opportunities

We have always contended that the chapter environment is a powerful catalyst for developing future leaders. To that end, we granted \$226,753 for leadership programs, including the newly created values-based Leadership Institute, which is part of the Building Courageous Leaders initiative.

Healthy Brothers

We are concerned for the health of our brothers. We are a fraternity with over 11,000 undergraduate members, but our chapters are small enough that they can help brothers in emotional need. We provide education to prevent problems and intervene with mental health and substance abuse and how to get the support needed. We spent \$106,995 toward health concerns.

As a service to house corporations we provided grants for construction of qualifying educational space, renovations or maintenance which totaled \$948,148. These grants are funded by generous brothers for such specific projects,

sometimes over a few years, and do not come from the Foundation's general funds.

White Star Legacy Society

We are so grateful to those brothers who donate by including the Foundation in their estate plans. Many brothers have significantly impacted the Foundation with estate gifts: **William T. Morris (Penn State 1949)**, **Michael O. Shipley (Syracuse 1958)**, **James H. Hendrie (Florida 1950)**, **Robert B. Evans (Penn 1946)** and **Ed Matthews (Penn 1949)**. Foundation Income

Gifts to the Foundation for all funds totaled \$2,529,871 from 2,953 donors in 2017.

The Annual Fund benefited from 2,175 donors who gave \$728,288 in unrestricted gifts, which are used to fund grants to the Fraternity for educational programs, scholarships, administration of the foundation, stewardship and fund raising.

A total of 423 brothers gave \$500 or more to the Perge! Society Annual Fund. They are recognized at four levels on **page 57** for their unrestricted gifts. 2018 will mark the 21st year of the Perge! Society. This fundraising Society has defined our success for two decades. Thank you, brothers, for your generosity.

Endowment

We also use endowment income/appreciation as directed by the donor to fund scholarships, leadership programs, alcohol education and general operations of the Foundation. The Foundation's principal investments were \$10,254,418 at the end 2017. Current income from these investments combined with annual fund donations was sufficient to meet current program expenses. Additional assets of \$7,589,232 are restricted for chapter scholarships and qualifying chapter building projects.

The endowment funds are invested by a professional manager under the oversight of an investment committee, made up of board members and volunteer brothers experienced in financial management. The return on our investments for the 2017 calendar year was 16.2%.

Your Foundation operates using these guiding principles: use our grants to encourage excellence; be open and willing to try new approaches to solve problems; remain good stewards of your gifts; develop relationships to strengthen Phi Gamma Delta. As a result of using these principles, we like what happened in 2017.

We have many reasons to be thankful as 2017 was another strong year for the Foundation.

We continue to stay focused on areas that foster, challenge and grow our brothers. We awarded \$48,500 in scholarships this year, tying last year and our second most historically. We issued 16 - \$500 Academic Achievement Awards (Triple A) to all newly initiated members who earn a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale. We also awarded 42 scholarships of \$1,000 each to deserving undergraduate and graduate brothers. These awards have helped to place an importance on academics in our chapters.

Your generous financial support allowed us to grant 69% of unrestricted income to brothers and chapters in the form of scholarships, leadership training and alcohol abuse education. We continue to keep our administration costs including fund raising and operating the Foundation low at 13% of income; which is an excellent percentage!

Our unrestricted giving was also higher this year allowing us to be generous in grants. Estate gifts continued to be important to our ability to fund with the estate of **William H. Gear (McGill 1956)** again this year generously benefiting the Foundation. We are grateful to the brothers who have planned in advance to benefit Phi Gamma Delta this way. We also want to thank the hundreds of brothers over the last few years who donated to the Foundation. Keep it up brothers as your chapter benefits from your support!
